## Safeguarding Faith Is Vitally Essential To Good Citizenship

New York Business Man Leaves \$1,200,000 in Bequests to Numerous Catholic Institutions, and Explains That He Is Not Actuated by Bigotry or Indifference to Other Churches or Charities

THIRTY-FIVE INSTITUTIONS ARE REMEMBERED IN WILL OF G. L. DUVAL

New York, March 27.—The will of George L. Duval, Catholic philanthropist, probated here this week, left a total of \$1,200,000 to \$5 Catholic institutions, and contained the following remarkable explanation of his reasons:

"Lest my friends of other religious denominations should misconstructhe preference I have shown during may life, and now in this, my last will and testament, for Catholic charities, I desire to preclaim my reasons. All Catholics know how essential to good citizenship among our co-religionists is the preservation of their faith. Once that is lost, moral sense is blunted and those at least in the lens favored stations of life are apt to become public charges. Moreover, a large majority of those who suffer from poverty and distress are in our fold, whereas on the other hand affuence is in inverse ratio compared with other denominations. My procedure, therefore, has not been inspired by any spirit of bigetry or indifference to the needs of humanity at large or lack of approximation of the many worthy institutions of other denominations that are providing relief and comfort." New York, March 27. Last Saturday the last of the scaffolding was taken down from the 200-foot dirigible mooring mast atop the Empire State Building. This marked the practical completion of the world's tallest sky scraper. The tip of the mast is 1,248 feet above Fifth Avenue and Thirty-fourth 33,000 Ntdl8 Street, wheras the spire of the Chrysler building, which for-merly held the altitude record, is

1.046 feet above street level. 
