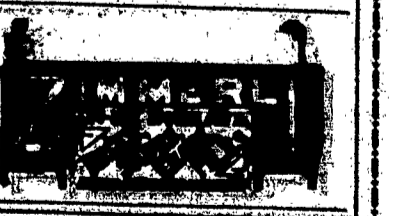
Lactare Medal Will Be Given to James J. Phelan
 Boston Banker and Philanthropist Selected by Notre Dame University as Outstanding Catholic Layman.
 Notre Dame, March 27.—Announcement was made here Sunday that James J. Phelan, Boston banker and philanthropist, will be given the 1931 Lactare medal by Notre Dame University. The presentation date will be made known later. Mr. Phelan was selected in view of his worth as one of the nation's outstanding Catholic laymen in conformance with the traditions of the Lactare award, an honor which has been conferred year after year on men and women who have proved their worth to their country and their fellowmen.

A Life of Service
 The career of James J. Phelan can be summarized only at the expense of many achievements which have contributed to his worth, the recognition of which is accorded to him today. He has been a member of practically every relief committee formed in the State of Massachusetts during the past 25 years, including the San Francisco Relief Committee, Chelsea Fire, Salem Fire, Messina Earthquake, and Ohio Flood. He organized the New England Saw Mill Unit, the first contribution of America to the World War before we entered the War; served on all the Liberty Loan drives as a member of the Executive Committee and was Chairman of the Boston Metropolitan Victory Loan Drive. He served as a member of the Committee of Eleven of the United War Work Campaign, raising \$200,000,000 instead of \$130,000,000 as originally planned. He served as Assistant Post Administrator of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts for 22 months during the war, as a member of the Massachusetts Industrial Safety Committee. He was President of the Associated Members of the 101st Infantry which raised over \$100,000 for the benefit of the families of the regiment while the regiment was active on the other side. He was Chairman of the relief committee on the occasion of the visit to Boston of His Eminence Cardinal Mercier, Chairman of the Massachusetts Branch of the American Committee for Relief in Ireland raising one-sixth of the fund of \$5,000,000 of a subscription basis for the suffering women and children in Ireland. He was emergency Post Administrator for seven months in 1922 and 1923.

First U. S. Lay Knight of Malta
 Mr. Phelan was honored by the Pope in being the first lay Knight of Malta in the United States. He was also appointed Knight Commander of the Order of Pope Pius IX, and in March of 1928 was honored with a Grand Cross of the Sovereign Military Order of Malta. At the present time Mr. Phelan is serving as Chairman of the Massachusetts Emergency Committee on Unemployment.

Born in Toronto
 Mr. Phelan was born in Toronto, Canada, in 1871, but was brought to Boston by his parents when nine years old. He has since made his home there. He is prominent and active in business and social circles, and is well liked and highly respected.
 Since 1883, when John G. Shea became the original Lactare medalist, Notre Dame has honored many from the ranks of the Catholic laity. Among the 48 names in the list of Lactare Medal recipients appear men and women from every walk of life. All are internationally known statesmen, artists, financiers, actors, soldiers, writers, scientists, poets—all are Catholics, and leaders in their work. Last year Frederick P. Kenkel was chosen, and the year before Alfred E. Smith. In 1928 Jack J. Spalding was the recipient, and the year previous Margaret Anglin was the medalist. In 1925 Edward N. Hurley received the medal.

Only if our daughters are responsible and our sons are honorable and clean may we hope for heroes in our midst.

Passion of Christ to Be Broadcast From Church Over C. B. S. Network



Principals in the drama to be broadcast from the Shrine of the Little Flower Church in Detroit over the Columbia Broadcasting System network on Sunday, evening, March 29th, at 7 P. M., EST. A drama entitled "The Trial and Passion of Jesus Christ" will be broadcast over a nation-wide hook-up of the Columbia Broadcasting System at 7 P. M., EST., Sunday, March 29, the period known as "The Golden Hour of the Little Flower," which is directed by Rev. Father Charles Coughlin, pastor of the Shrine of the Little Flower in Detroit.

The drama was written by Father Coughlin, who will also interpret the role of the Historian. The cast will be from the Detroit Civic Theatre, which under the directorship of Miss Jessie Bonstelle is known for its work in behalf of the better type drama.

Father Coughlin, who instituted the Golden Hour of the Little Flower as an air feature. In the space of a few short months has become one of the best known Catholic priests in America. His powerful sermons have attracted a fan mail that runs to more than 100,000 letters a week.

The drama will be broadcast from the Little Flower Church, which is located at Woodward Avenue and Twelve-Mile Road in Detroit. While the congregation will be invited, guests they will hear it in the same

manner as the radio audience, as it will be played behind a screen. The full choir of the church, assisted by several notable soloists, will furnish the musical background.

Miss Bonstelle will play the role of Mary, the Mother of Christ. Other roles and their interpreters are as follows:

It will be possible for any church or religious group to hold a special audition of the drama in their church or auditorium. The only requirement is a receiving set tuned into the nearest Columbia broadcasting system station.

As far as is known this is the first time that a regular professional theatrical company has united with a religious organization in giving a drama played from the altar of the church itself.
