## Parish School Baseball League Will Start Games With 22 Teams, April 29

Teams, Divided into Three Leagues, Will Play Series of Games in City Parks—Silver Trophy Will Be Presented to Champions by Bishop O'Hern

The Rochester Parish School Baseball League, newly organized, and with 22 teams on its roster, will spring into life and being on Wednesday afternoon, April 29, when the opening games of the League will be played. More than 300 budding "Babe" Ruths will be enrolled in the League as players, and the League will be divided into three sections, Southern, Eastern and Western. The champion of each section will play for the championship of the city at the close of the season, and then the champion of the city will play a series of games with the champion of the Elmira Parochial School League for the championship of the Diocese.

**Bishop Backs League**  
The baseball League has the hearty approval and backing of His Rt. Rev. John Francis O'Hern, Bishop of Rochester, and it is being organized under his supervision by a committee of priests appointed by him. This committee is composed of the Rev. F. William Stauder, Rev. Leo C. Mooney, Rev. John M. Duffy, Rev. Leonard Kelly and Rev. George C. Vogt, with Father Vogt acting as President and Manager of the League.

**Teams in The League**  
The following teams are in the League:  
Southern League—St. Mary's Boys' Orphan Asylum, St. Augustine's, Blessed Sacrament, St. Monica, Our Lady of Good Counsel, St. Mary's and St. Boniface.

**Western League**—St. Patrick's Cathedral, St. Peter & Paul, Holy Apostles, Holy Rosary, St. Charles Borromeo, St. Anthony, Sacred Heart.

**Eastern League**—St. Michael's, St. George's, St. Stanislaus, St. Andrew's, St. Francis Xavier, Our Lady of Mt. Carmel, St. John the Evangelist, and St. Margaret Mary's.

**Play in City Parks**  
The games will be played in the various parks of the city, on Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday afternoons, beginning Wednesday afternoon, April 29. The grand play-off for the championship of the city will not take place until after the school examinations in June. This will enable the star batters to keep their eyes on the ball and not on mathematics or chemistry.

Each team will play seven games. Each section of the League will be managed by a priest who knows and loves baseball. There will be dependable umpires for all games, these to be selected by the priests in charge.

**Seven-Inning Games**  
Seven-inning games will be played. It is expected that the teams will have quite a crowd of boosters from the various parishes, and that the League will develop in a big proportion, augmented later on by other teams from other parish schools.
