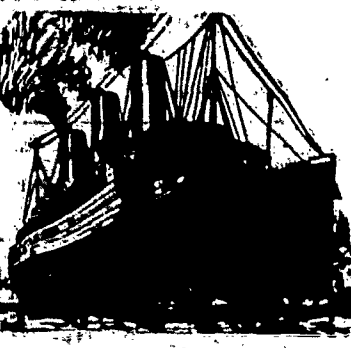

Five Hundred Men Attend The Communion Breakfast Of The Nocturnal Society

Second Annual Event Was Inspiring Occasion—Bishop O'Hern Celebrant of the Mass and Speaker At the Breakfast.

The second annual Communion Breakfast of the Nocturnal Adoration Society was held Sunday morning in the ball room of the Powers Hotel. More than 500 men attended. All were present promptly at the 7:30 Mass in St. Patrick's Cathedral, celebrated by the Rt. Rev. John Francis O'Hern, Bishop of Rochester, and all received Holy Communion in a body. Bishop O'Hern assisted in the distribution of Communion, and at the close of the Mass he spoke appreciatively of the work and purposes of the society and of the fidelity of the members.

Under the supervision of Manager Joseph A. Smith of the Powers Hotel, a most appetizing breakfast was served to the members. The service was prompt, and every courtesy was shown to the guests.

The Rev. Charles J. Shay, rector of the Cathedral, and spiritual director of the Society, called the meeting to order. "There is no greater society in the world," he said, "than a society of men banded together for the purpose of adoring Christ in the Blessed Sacrament of the Altar."

James P. Duffy, president of the Society, was the first speaker. He gave a glowing account of the work of the Society, and to Secretary William G. Wynne for his excellent work at all times. He spoke appreciatively of the loyalty of the members, and thanked all for their good support.

Attorney James E. Cuff was the first speaker. Mr. Cuff gave a very excellent talk. He spoke of the splendid work done in Rochester by all three Bishops of the Diocese. He said the wonderful growth of the Church was partly due to the cooperation and help of the laymen, and said it was impossible for priests to look after everything pertaining to the welfare of the Church.

It will be an impressive ceremony, and all their friends will be welcome to attend the service.

The retreat is open to all Catholic men, and reservations should be made in advance at St. Bernard's Seminary. This retreat is growing in popularity each year, and a very large attendance is anticipated in June.
