REMOVAL OF STAINS

Grease, oil and wax spots can be removed from any cloth with benzene... Paint and enamel from any cloth with methylated spirit or etherform.

Tar and pitch benzene or ether.
Blood (1) from silk and wool by washing in water... Iron rust and writing ink from all cloth with weak solution of oxalic acid.

Grass stains from all cloth with ether, or soap, in methylated spirit... Grease from silks—Take a lump of magnesia, rub it wet on the spot, let it dry, then brush the powder off.

Dr. John Ryan Says Five Billion Should Be Appropriated by America For Expenditure on Public Works

Catholic Educator and Economist Says This Would Provide Employment for One Million Workers, Besides Many Others on Materials.

St. Louis, Mo., May 8.—The Rev. Dr. John Ryan, professor of moral theology and industrial ethics at Catholic University, Washington, and perhaps the best known Catholic sociologist in the country, declares that a bond issue of five billion dollars for public works should be created by the U. S. Government for the purpose of relieving the unemployed situation... It is Daily Needed

The bill passed at the last session of Congress, providing for an outlay of \$115,000,000, for new public works, Dr. Ryan characterized as being a venture in the right direction... The expenditure of \$5,000,000,000 within two years on buildings, roads, navigation, flood control, reforestation, elimination of grade crossings and other legitimate public enterprises would give employment to 1,000,000 persons...

The blue laws are causing a deplorable situation locally, inasmuch as the wealthy clubman can go to his country club for his favorite game while the youth of the city is denied his golf and baseball and forced very often to spend his Sunday in dangerous idleness.
