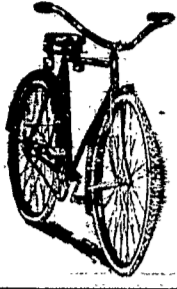

Parish League Baseball Champions Race Nears Its Deciding Conclusion

St. Monica Team Defeats Sacred Heart in Close and Fast Game, and Will Try Conclusions With St. John's —Tri-City Games Coming.

The Parish League Baseball season is nearing its climax. St. Monica's team, champion of the Southern League, defeated the Sacred Heart team, champion of the Western League, in a fast and close game on St. John's diamond, Humboldt Street, last Friday. The score was 2 to 1. On Thursday afternoon this week—just a little too late for the details for this issue, of *The Catholic Courier and Journal*—St. Monica's and St. John's teams battled for the championship of the city at the Edgerton Park Playground. The winner of this contest will play for the championship of the Diocese with the champion teams of Auburn and Elmira—St. Hyacinth's for Auburn, and St. Patrick's for Elmira.

The game last Friday was a splendid game. There was a fine crowd of rooters at the game Friday, including Bishop O'Hern, who offered \$5.00 for every home run in the game. Most of the boys strained their spinal columns trying to make the Bishop a poorer but happier man, but a sprinkling of three-baggers was the best the batters could do. The players gave a marvelous exhibition of juvenile baseball, every one of them showing the skill and nerve of trained veterans.

Features of the contest were the batting of Sullivan for St. Monica's and the fast fielding of both teams, and especially the work of the Sacred Heart infield. Flynn, shortstop for Sacred Heart, distinguished himself, Sullivan got a single and triple at bat. The lineup and scores:
