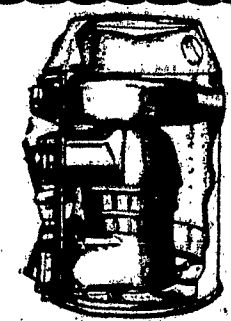

An example of an improvement which fills a long-felt want, is the erection of the car stop in front of the seminary of a building to serve as a waiting room for priests and students going to the city. The building is a fine contrast with the general style of the seminary buildings, and will be of service in protecting priests and students from the severe winds which prevail during the winter season.

Two Collections Optional
"The total amount required for our seminaries has been placed before the individual pastors with a suggested portion to be raised by each parish. Your pastor will make known to you the amount your parish will be requested to raise, and will have your fullest co-operation in securing this amount. Your contribution should be made sufficiently large and generous to represent your fair share of the burden of seminary support resting on your church, and to represent likewise what you feel you would want to give to support the seminaries over a period of two months. Pastors have the option of raising the amount suggested in one collection on Seminary Sunday, October 4, 1931; or to raise it through a collection on this day and a second collection to be taken before June 30, 1932, on a Sunday to be specified by the Pastor.
