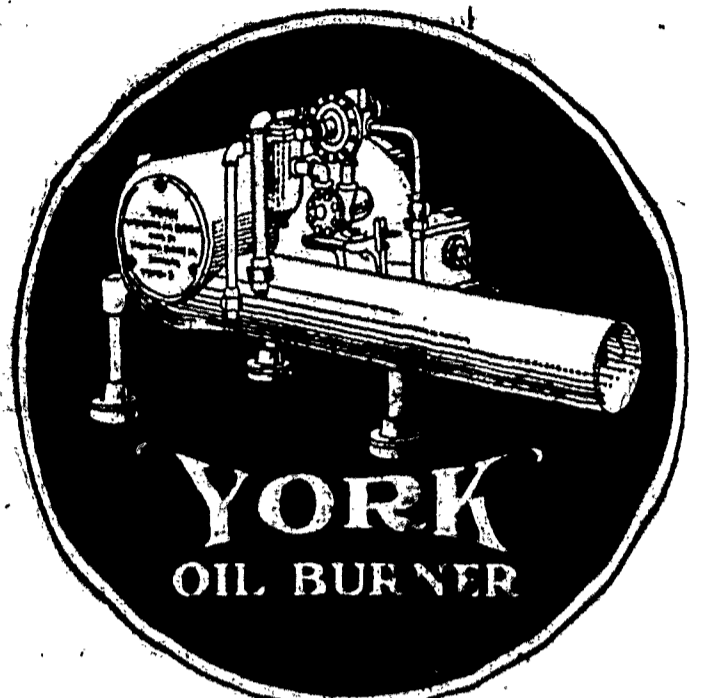

Glare of Light Is Bad For Eyes; Care Necessary

Some one discovered that the rays of an electric light directed against the ceiling instead of full on the paper of the worker practically eliminated eye strain and we now have indirect lighting. There was a heavy toll in blindness before men came to the realization that they could not defy the killing ray of ray acetylene or electric torches for cutting steel or the blast of a furnace, without adequate protection for their eyes. Snow blindness is as much feared in the north as the biting cold. Not only in such exceptional cases but in all light there are rays injurious to the human eye under certain conditions. Geographically there is no immunity from them. They are present in every latitude and every temperature. The glare of a thousand varying lights and colors are continually fighting to irritate our eyes. The blinding sun of mid summer, the less intense but more brilliantly colored sunsets; the glare from coated book paper under a bright electric light, often compel to break down that delicate organ. Modern science has given us a means of combating these harmful rays without impairing clear vision, as in the case of ordinary colored lens, which at best are disfiguring in appearance. Glare is an unpleasant sensation produced by light. The unpleasantness is described in many ways. It may be the inability to see clearly. It may be a burning or itching of the lids or a headache after reading or exposure to bright lights. If you have any of the above conditions, you should have your eyes examined by an optometrist who without the aid of drugs or medicine but through the skillful use of scientific instruments measures the human eye and prescribes glasses for its use. Cuts In Wages Are Assailed At Conference

Director of National Catholic School of Social Service Makes Sharp Criticism of Corporations.

Wilkes-Barre, Oct. 9.—The wage-cutting orders of several corporations, including the United States Steel Corporation, were denounced at the final session of the Catholic Charities Conference here last week by Dr. Francis H. Haas, director of the National Catholic School of Social Service at Washington. Dr. Haas charged that the present condition of the country was due to the payment of too many of the national income in dividends and not enough in wages. "What is pertinent here is that the reduction in wages of steel workers was simply announced," he said. "The workers were not consulted. No substance of negotiation was entered into. No account was taken of the fact that, in the steel towns, many of the workers, lucky enough to be employed, are working only three days a week. The order was merely issued, in the absence of union organization, in the steel industry. Unions Are Important "If the industry had been organized, this autocratic and unjust action could have been opposed and wages levels at least maintained. It is not too much to say that 12 all Americans who earned had been organized during the past 40 years, or at least 70 or 80 per cent of their number, the present tragic condition of unemployment and business stagnation could not exist. Dr. Haas advocated the establishment of a "white list" of employers in every industry, giving names, places of business and boards of directors to free the "fair employer from the handicap placed upon him by the unfair employer." The delegates passed a resolution pleading support and "pledging loyalty" to the principles enunciated by Pope Pius XI in his encyclical on Christian marriage and reconstruction of the social order and thanking him for his apostolic blessing. Officers Chosen James F. Murray of Detroit was chosen to succeed William L. Igoe of St. Louis as president of the organization. The Right Rev. Msgr. James H. Ryan, rector of the Catholic University at Washington, was re-elected honorary president. P. H. White of Wilkes-Barre, the Rev. C. H. Lombard of Cleveland, William P. Lynch of Omaha, J. Wiseman MacDonald of Los Angeles and Miss Frances Maher of Kane, Pa., were elected vice presidents. Thomas F. Farrell of New York was retained as treasurer, the Rev. Dr. John O'Grady of Washington as secretary and the Rev. Francis Melton of Indianapolis and Miss Alice E. Taggart of Washington as assistant secretaries.
