### Soviet Agents Are In Ireland To Ruin Church

#### Two Irish Labor Leaders Expelled From Labor Party Because They Voted in Favor of Safety Law.

Dublin, Oct. 30—A sensation was caused Saturday by the expulsion from the Parliamentary Labor party of two of its most influential and courageous members—Daniel Morrissey, representing Tipperary in the Dail, and Richard Antony, representing the city of Cork. The reason for the expulsion was their action in voting for the public safety act, against the accepted policy of their party.

Mr. Morrissey, who is Deputy Speaker of the Dail, had an enthusiastic reception at a crowded meeting of his constituents last night. "The condition of affairs in the Free State today," he said, "is much more serious than many people realize. At Tipperary, men have been dragged out of their beds and murdered by the roadside without a chance of preparing their souls to go before their God. There have been organized attempts to smash the established State.

There are secret paid agents of Russia in Ireland today whose object is not only to overthrow the state but to overthrow the Church. I would be unworthy to represent the people of Tipperary if I stood for crimes of such enormity. Every law-abiding citizen will realize I did what was right. It is understood that both men will sit in the Dail as independents.
