## Calls Catholic University Missionary Training Center — For Religious Work in America

### Thirty-two Colleges Conducted by Religious Orders Are Affiliated With the University, and Are Part of its Great Student Family.

Washington, Nov. 27.—The Catholic University of America has been described as the nucleus of a missionary training center of the new world, which the Church must look for leaders to carry the Faith into the far corners of the earth, as well as to the remote corners of this continent.

According to an article, "A Source of Unity in American Catholic Life," by the Rev. Dr. Maurice S. Sheedy, in a recent issue of "Extension Magazine."

Thirty-two colleges, representing twenty-nine religious orders, maintain houses of study on the campus where men are prepared for the mission field. A Sisters' college, which are clustered a group of convents, has been established for the many nuns who study at the University.

Two most promising students from nearly every diocese and every country are to be found at the University, and a course of study for the Catholic Church maintains in the Catholic University an institution for higher learning and for breadth of courses and faculty which can not be duplicated in any part of the United States.

Great Unifying Force  
This "pooling of interests" by the bishops of the United States, who have direct control over the University, and the influence it has on the students from all parts of the country during the most formative years of their lives, has made the Catholic University "the foremost unifying force of the Catholic Church in America."

The growth of the associated institutions has been gradual. When the University was established in 1863 there was one college attached to it, St. Thomas College, which was the House of Studies. The numbers grew slowly until 1918 when 12 were affiliated, among them the Paulists, the Mariists, the Congregation of the Holy Cross, the Franciscans, the Dominicans, St. John Kantius College and the Sisters of the Holy Family. Since 1918 the number has grown rapidly to 32, three new colleges being established in the past year.

Like a Great Family  
The relationship established between these semi-independent colleges and the University itself is an unusual one. As the author explains it: "In most American Universities there is rigid centralization, institutionalism, but the relationship of the Catholic University of America with its affiliated colleges is more like the organization of a family."

The several religious Orders and Societies run their houses according to their own rule; many houses teach a number of courses within their own walls; their students may take a few or many courses at the University. What they are definitely members of the Catholic University, such that they may take advantage of its facilities, such as the Library, the cultural activities and the social life. Perhaps no two of the subordinate colleges use their affiliation with the University in exactly the same way.

Training Its Own Leaders

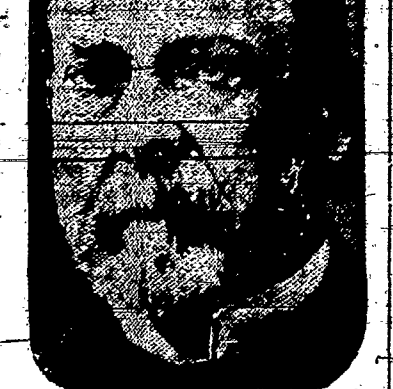

## St. ct Treasury Rules as to Damaged Money

There is no federal law forbidding the total destruction of coins by their owners. But there is a statute forbidding the mutilation or lightening of a coin in such a way that the original coin may later be circulated in its impaired condition. It is also illegal to deface a coin without removing any part of it.

Occasionally the ashes of burned money are identified by the Treasury department and redeemed at face value. But no relief is granted by the government to the owners of paper currency totally destroyed. Three-fifths or more of a mutilated United States paper currency bill, note or certificate is redeemable at face value by the Treasury department. When less than three-fifths, but more than two-fifths of the original bill remains, it is redeemable at one-half the face value of the original bill. Such fragments, however, must be accompanied by satisfactory evidence, as affidavits, subscribed and sworn to before a notary public, setting forth the cause and manner of destruction.

## Great Ox Among Others of Vanished Animals

Caesar wrote of an animal which he called "urox." In size, he said, it was a little less than elephants; in appearance and color and form they are bulls. Great is their strength and great their swiftness; they spare neither man nor beast whom they have perceived. These (the Germans) take pains to catch in pits and kill." Caesar, the scientist assumes, probably was writing of the great ox whose skull and other bones are found in so many drained marshes, clay pits and caves across the length and breadth of Europe. And if the animal still lived in Caesar's day, how much longer did it continue? Various "proofs" of its persistence have been forthcoming; none is wholly satisfactory. Perhaps the most likely is the report of Baron Heberstein, who, returning from Muscovy in 1850, wrote of a race of animals obviously greater than the bison which then lived in the Polish forests; but some scientists suspect that he merely saw a race of cattle gone wild.
