more so when various members of the Federal Congress have declared themselves publicly in favor of anti-religious policies and launched all manner of charges against the Church.

Early Reform Doubtful

This hostility, the Archbishop said, is so strong at present that earlier plans to seek amendment of the religious provisions of the constitution have been postponed indefinitely.

The Veracruz law, which restricted the Church to two bishops and eleven priests in a state of 1,300,000 inhabitants and which was promptly copied by Yucatan and Chiapas, has caused the Church to be closed in those states, the Archbishop said. Religious services have long been suspended in Tabasco for similar reasons. The other states where the movement for restriction legislation is most serious now are Chihuahua, Zacatecas, Jalisco, Aguascalientes and Michoacan.

The Archbishop in a recent public statement declared anti-religious propaganda was being disseminated through many schools and encouraged by many officials.

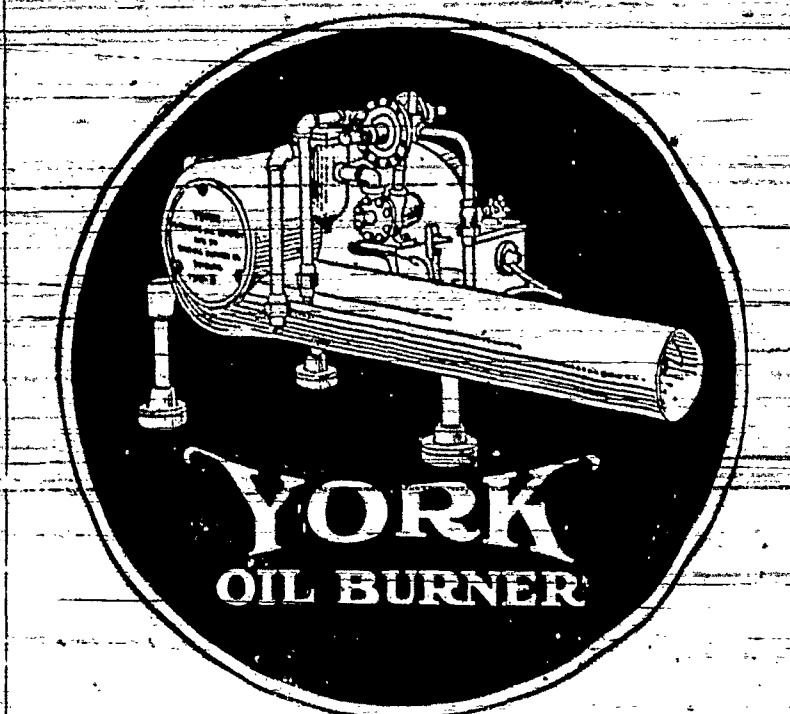
