Jews Unite With Catholics To Honor Priest

New York, Dec. 31—While parishioners of St. Nicholas' Church here were recently honoring their pastor, the Rev. John A. Nagelosen, on the occasion of his 70th birthday, a delegation from the Jewish Congregation Masses Benjamin, A. P., the synagogue which is located behind St. Nicholas' Church, entered the room and presented the priest an engrossed resolution expressing their well wishes and "the affection and esteem in which he is held by his Jewish neighbors of the East Side."

Deputy Attorney General Charles A. Schneider, who headed the committee of Jewish neighbors, declared that because of Father Nagelosen's "kind friendliness" the congregation "wished to demonstrate their gratitude and affection in some public manner."

Dr. Fulton Sheen Is Speaker Now On Catholic Hour

Washington, Dec. 31—The Rev. Dr. Fulton J. Sheen, professor of Philosophy of Religion at the Catholic University of America, will be heard in the "Catholic Hour," sponsored by the National Council of Catholic Men, every Sunday for 14 weeks. He began his series of talks last Sunday, December 27. He succeeds the Rev. James M. Gillis, C.S.P., editor of the Catholic World, whose series ended the previous Sunday.

heavens seemed brighter, the sun more golden, the vegetation vibrant, the waters of the bay like indigo, the birds, as it were, training their little throats in happy chirps, even little vesperine with its spiral column of threatening gasps told me that God is in the earthquake as He is in the sunshine.

"Father, not to draw this out too great lengths, I never said any more attention to the crowd that I came with. I forgot that they were excited. I was wrapped up in self and the still voice that urged me on. To Rome I must go, to Rome at once. And to Rome I went and transposing the ancient Caesars triumphant cry 'I came, I saw—but I was conquered.'"

"The train, even though direct, speeded not half as fast as I wished. I had set out to visit Rome as a tourist but somehow that plan fell flat.

"Oh, don't smile, Father, I know your thoughts. Yes, I fell but what a happy day it was for me. More so for the grandest woman in this world, my wife and her little flock, for now I could see the why and wherefore of it all."

"Yes, Father, I visited St. Peter's. I knelt at the shrine of Peter and Paul. I went about and saw the tomb of Pope After Pope, successor of the One whom Jesus Christ made the Prince of the Apostles. Mexican Senator Is Expelled From Revolutionary Party for Displaying Papal Colors Home

Bigoted Leader of National Party Makes Savage Attack Upon Another Senator Who Refused to Sign Anti-Clerical Manifesto

Mexico City, Dec. 31.—Senator Gilman del Valle was expelled recently from the National Revolutionary Party, the controlling political group in Mexico's superior legislative chamber, for having allowed his residence to be adorned by the papal colors during the recent Guadalupe festivities.

Senator del Valle, although showing no particular desire to remain a member of the party, explained that he had committed no particular crime in having shown deference to his wife, who wished to adorn her home in that manner.

Deputy Gonzalo Santos, party agitator and leader of the bloc, next turned his attention to Senator Gilman, charging that the latter had refused to sign an anti-clerical manifesto adopted by the Senate.

Senator Gilman attempted to treat the charge as a spiteful personal attack, but Deputy Santos, because so violent in his language that some members feared shouting might result, the incident ended without a resolution being adopted.

The last event in the tempestuous session was a resolution demanding that the Minister of Finance, Luis Montejo de Oca, explain why a grant organ recently installed in the hotel at Guadalupe, imported from Germany, was allowed to be brought into Mexico without the payment of customs dues.

These incidents are looked upon as manifestations of rage on the part of the anti-clerical leaders because of the tremendous interest and national wide enthusiasm aroused by the recent 10th anniversary celebration of the appearance of the Most Holy Virgin at Guadalupe.

Rome, Dec. 31.—Premier Mussolini made what was interpreted as an otherwise in the direction of peace with the Vatican recently by announcing the appointment of Cardinal Gasparri as ambassador to the Holy See. The appointment was made by the Council of Ministers in the presence of the King and the President of the Council.
