

Fire Causes \$1,500 Damage At St. Joseph's

Early Morning Blaze in Sacristy Burned Cassocks of Altar Boys and Did Considerable Other Damage.

On Thursday morning last week an early morning fire in the sacristy of St. Joseph's Church on Franklin Street caused damage estimated at \$1,500 to the building itself and \$500 to cassocks of altar boys and other supplies.

The fire was discovered just as the closing prayers were being said at the 7 o'clock Mass. Smoke appeared in the church as the people were leaving at the close of the Mass.

Brother James, C.S.S.R., walking through a corridor in the rear of the church building, discovered the fire. He summoned others who turned two hand chemical extinguishers on the fire, emptying them only to find the blaze beyond their control. Firemen were summoned by telephone.

The blaze was confined to the sacristy, but had discovery been later, or had the fire occurred at night, it would have been of far more serious consequences.
