Priest-Scientist Writes About Aniakhak, Alaska's Great Volcanic Mountain

For Eleven Days This Volcano Sent a Continuous Stream of Gases, Pumice Rocks and Ashes Miles Into Air Over Thousands of Miles

The Rev. Bernard R. Hubbard, S.J., of the University of Santa Clara, California, explorer and scientist, has a most interesting article in the January 2d number of The Saturday Evening Post, entitled "Aniakhak, the Moon Crater Explodes."

The Geological Survey had pronounced Aniakhak dead. Father Hubbard writes that he was in Seward, on the Gulf of Alaska, late in January, 1931, and that an earthquake shock broke dishes and stopped clocks.

The eruption lasted uninterruptedly until the evening of May 11, when a final terrific explosion shook the surrounding country and sent rocks and ashes into the air which descended in such great masses as to make it pitch dark for several hours at distances more than sixty miles from the volcano.
