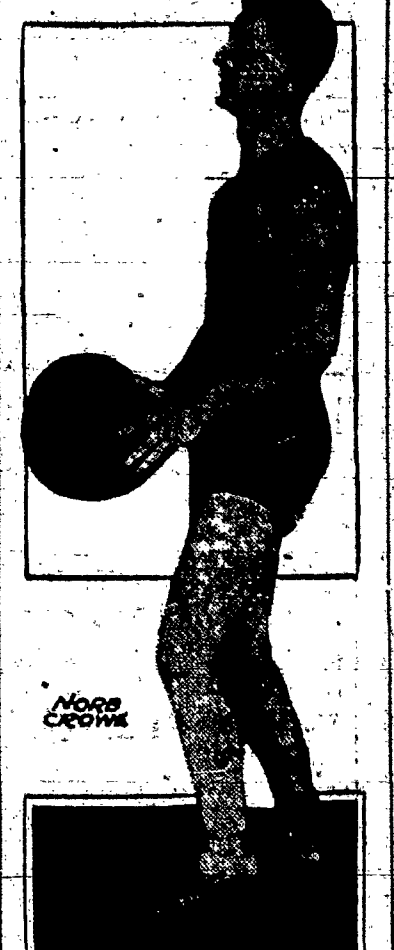
Savoldi Praises Carideo, Brill And Chris Cagle

The appointment of two new Diocesan consultors was announced on Tuesday by the Rt. Rev. John Francis O'Hern, D.D., Bishop of Rochester. The Rev. Arthur A. Hughes, rector of Holy Rosary Church, and the Rev. John P. Schellhorn, rector of Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church, in announcing the appointment of Bishop O'Hern said:

"Father Hughes is now the oldest alumnus of St. Bernard's Seminary, being the connecting link between the old St. Joseph's Seminary in Troy and St. Bernard's here. Father Schellhorn is pastor of one of the principal German parishes in the city and also is one of the oldest St. Bernard's graduates, having been a member of the second class. I think both priests are widely known throughout the Diocese, and are greatly beloved by their associate priests and by their parishioners. They are capable and zealous pastors, and their experience and judgment will make them valuable members of the Diocesan Board."
