Baseball, Tennis and Track Schedules Are Announced—Five Big Ten Conference Teams Will Be Played

Notre Dame, Mar. 18.—The schedules of the University of Notre Dame's baseball, tennis and track teams have been announced by Athletic Director Jesse C. Harper.

Five Big Ten Conference teams will be faced by the Notre Dame baseball team. Of these, Wisconsin, Northwestern, Iowa and Indiana have been played in the past.

The tennis team will open its season at home on April 15 against the Indiana State Teachers. The team will engage in eight matches, four at home and four away from home.

The outdoor track season for Notre Dame opens April 29 and 30 with the Drake relays. One of the features of the schedule is the meet with the West Point team at Notre Dame on May 28.

Holy Apostles won a thrilling game from Cathedral, 30 to 23, and took third place in the tournament.

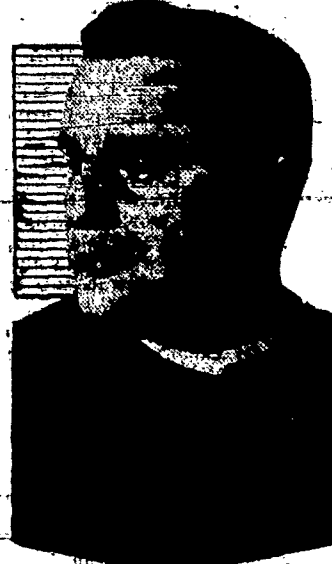
Francis Villon First Great Poet of Nation

Few are unfamiliar with the most dominant aspects of the career of Francis Villon, student, brewer, layman, knight, rascal, roving burglar and homicide who became the first great poet of the fifteenth century.

Before him there had been Burgundians and Armagnacs, poets of Politics and poets of Notrandy, but it needed the sacrifice of Joan of Arc in the year of Villon's birth to recollect the warring factions that constituted the French state.

It is to Villon, too, that a latter time owes its most vivid accounts of life in Paris of the fifteenth century. From the unlighted streets, wolf ridded and unguarded in the cruellest storms of winter, from the foul sinks of vice where half the brigands and beggars of Europe overgathered.
