

These three Sacramentaries contain a precious treasure of liturgical traditions. The three Popes named faithfully preserved the ancleat formulas and enhanced or per fected them with additions suitable to the times.
Our Missals, from which the Mass

read or sung, are derived principally from the Gregorian Sacramentary. In fact what is known as the Canon of the Mass received its last addition under Gregory L. The rest of the constituent parts in the Roman Liturgy of the Mass date back to the 4th and 5th century. In the Middle Ages the Missals were disfigured somewhat by unsuitable additions so that they needed reform. This was accomplished under Pope Plus V. Clement, VIII, and Urban restored to its original purity, sim-
