Judge Kadien Dies At Advanced Age

Long Island City, May 6.—Former Municipal Court Justice Thomas Charles Kadien, Sr., who was the first justice in the First District of the court in Queens and the father of County Judge Thomas C. Kadien, Jr., of Queens, died yesterday of pneumonia at his home, 30-59 Twenty-ninth Street, Long Island City, after a long illness. He was 81 years old.

Judge Kadien was born in Livingston Manor, N. Y., and was educated in St. John's College, now Fordham University. He was admitted to the bar in 1881, practiced law in Livingston Manor and in Denver, Colo., then moved to Long Island City. He was appointed to the bench in 1895.
