The incense symbolizes the envelopment of the mind by the sweetness of odor emanating from knowledge and practice of God's Law. As it were by the accomplishment of this desire we exhale spiritually a sweet and refreshing perfume. No rest is it then that we read from time to time the words of the bodies of His saints to emit sweet odor long after their mortal remains should have crumbled into dust. Let, even more as the result of their virtuous and heroic deeds countless bodies of the saints have supported the ordinary laws of decomposition. What might the hearts and minds of men take this into consideration and make them desirous of adorning their mortal remains with this spiritual preservative of real virtue.

After the reading of the Gospel the server answers in the name of the people: "Laus tibi, Christe!" Praise be to Thee, O Christ! The priest then kisses the initial words of the extract just read, saying at the same time: "By virtue of the words of the Gospel may our sins be blotted out." Indeed, we should be grateful for spiritual stimulus has been freely given us and by the exterior manifestation of this gratitude the priest would repeat by action the words of the royal psalmist: "More to be desired than gold, more precious than silver, more precious than the words of the Lord; and sweeter than honey and the honeycomb. Greatly purified by fire is Thy Word, O Lord, and Thy servant is exceedingly pleased therein. Yes, I love Thy Commandments more than gold and precious stones; they are the delight of my heart; in my exile, they have become to me a canticle. I opened my mouth and I sighed; for I long for Thy Commandments." Therein we see expressed what the world desires most - riches symbolized by gold - beauty by precious stones and pleasure by the honeycomb. Therefore, the Gospel just enunciated declares that even all these things are as nothing and are to be ground as glass; and the wisdom therein contained is expressed by Solomon when he said: "I loved her above health and beauty; and choose her instead of light; for her light can not be put out." If the Gospel is taken into the heart and preserved there is no doubt as to what beneficial effects it will produce for as the prophet Jeremiah says: "Are not My Words as a fire, saith the Lord, and as a hammer that breaketh the rock in pieces?" My dear friends, the words of the Lord are spirit and life and we are in the same position as the two disciples who met the Risen Christ on the way to Emmaus - they listened to the scriptures expounded to them and their hearts burned within them. Indeed, "The Gospel is the Power of God Unto Salvation to Everyone That Believeth."

(Continued from Page One) advocated so energetically a more equitable distribution of the goods of the earth and indicated the most efficacious means of restoring health and strength to the ailing social body, and tranquility and peace to its suffering members. Crusade of Prayer Plus XI calls for action by lay organizations and for a crusade of prayer, penance and almsgiving against greed; for peace for all, for peace of mind, and international concord. Internal spiritual change is necessary, he declares. "There is no peace to the wicked," says the Holy Spirit, he continues, "because they live in continuous struggle and conflict with the order established by nature and by its Creator. Only when this order is restored, when all peoples faithfully and spontaneously recognize and profess it, when the internal conditions of peoples and their outward relations with other nations are founded on this basis, then only will stable peace be possible on earth. But to create this atmosphere of lasting peace, neither peace treaties, nor the most solemn acts, nor international meetings or conferences, not even the noblest and most disinterested efforts of any statesman will be enough unless in the first place are recognized the sacred rights of natural and divine law." The end and purpose of life and time is nothing less than the service of God. All else is but vanity of vanities.
