Occupying One of Finest Sites, New Gallery Is Being Constructed to Give Paintings in Collection Proper Background and Lighting

Vatican City—Widespread interest is being taken in the new art gallery now nearing completion here...

The gallery occupies one of the highest and finest sites in the Vatican. It consists of two stories. The lower story is level with the eighteenth century garden...

The gallery is in the Renaissance style, and its general lines seem to have been suggested by the work of Bramante that is so strikingly exemplified in the neighboring structure of the Belvedere...

Upon this warm yet unobtrusive background, a somewhat gaudy color scheme has been superimposed by the employment of polychrome mosaics, stucco, ornamentation in stucco and medallions in mosaic...

Pastoral Letter Issued By BISHOP JOHN FRANCIS O'HERN, D.D.

Pastors of the city and nearby towns have received a letter from Most Rev. John Francis O'Hern, D.D., Bishop of Rochester, urging a large attendance at the Holy Name Societies' Rally in Red Wing Stadium on Sunday evening, June 12, beginning at 7:30 o'clock...

The letter complete is as follows: "Dear Reverend Father: We are passing through serious times with the every evidence of a lack of respect for law and order. We are anxious to make this demonstration a public profession of our regard for the Laws of God and of the Laws of the Land. Hence we shall look upon it as a public protest against lawlessness, crime, racketeering and every form of disorder, rebellion and civil authority."

"Feeling that you will welcome this opportunity to organize the Holy Name Society in your Holy Name Society, an organization which has been sanctioned in a very special manner by the Holy Name Society, and assuring you now of my fullest appreciation for your wholehearted cooperation in making this Rally the greatest possible success with the most cordial personal good wishes, I remain devotedly yours in Christ, JOHN FRANCIS O'HERN, Bishop of Rochester."

You will note the gathering is to be held in the evening so as not to interfere with the attendance at the Sunday Masses of the Holy Name men in their respective churches.

He is now forty-seven years old and possesses an enthusiastic temperament, a man of high ideals and aspirations, and ever ready, in the hands of God, to be of greater service to the Holy Name Society which he has now entered.

The diocese to which he has offered his services does not at all offer him any material attraction, being the poorest of all Catholic dioceses, able to get along with the aid of the charity of generous and devout Catholics. His family consists of his wife and seven children (two girls, five boys) all of whom, except one, are attending school. China Knows How to Meet A Depression

(Elder Service)

Liankoshwang (Hopei Province, China)—To the question whether or not there is a depression in China one might answer both yes and no with equal truthfulness. "If depression means a violent and sad state of things, contrasting with a previous situation more or less happy, there is no depression in China; that is because the precarious condition of millions of families, especially in the rural districts, and in the winter months has been reaching itself for centuries. If by the normal state, therefore, no one speaks of it, writes of it, and the good Chinese can with reason console himself thinking that if things are going badly abroad, here at home everything is running along as usual."

But a much different conclusion is reached if the actual facts are taken into consideration, that is, comparing the poverty of this land with that of the occident, comparing the misery of China with that of Europe and America. The word depression becomes nothing but a mild rhetorical flourish.

Chinese as a nation has for thousands of years found the solution for which specialists in economy of the west are cracking their heads in vain; it would be wonderful if every one were to admit it. To reduce one's needs to the very minimum and at the same time to make the best of the situation. Here is the secret. Can't there be money enough to buy many clothes? Very well then, one garment will suffice, one well padded with cotton. Can't the food suffer? No one complains, the children are sent into the mountains to gather dry grass to cook what there is to eat and to heat the huge beds, and on this the long hours are passed waiting for ten o'clock in the morning and five in the afternoon, the time fixed for the two meals. They are not workers, therefore, the ration can be reduced, and they can make up for it by good sleeping and smoking. There is one obligatory feast, New Year's. No one, however, is embarrassed by that; they all manage to celebrate somehow.
