Fr. Haas Gives "Planks" for Aid To Unemployed

Director of Catholic Social Service School Makes Recommendations at Philadelphia Meeting
Philadelphia—"Planks" in a program for meeting the present unemployment situation were submitted by the Rev. Dr. Francis J. Haas, director of the National Catholic School of Social Service, in an address which he delivered at the Annual Meeting of the National Conference of Social Work, just held here.

"The depression will go on until we stop swallowing slogans. The public official who uses catchwords to fool the public is a public enemy. 'What we need is plain thinking and plain talking.'
'Too long we have put up with the dishonest slogan, 'no dole,' 'balance the budget,' and 'don't soak the rich.'
'Why use the word 'dole' as if it were poison? Why is Federal relief a 'dole' and local relief not a 'dole'?"

parish although he has spent several years as pastor of a parish in the Bronx. The others were Bishop Curley of Syracuse and Coadjutor Archbishop Mitty, whom Bishop-elect Kearney succeeds as Bishop of Salt Lake.

The diocese of Salt Lake, which originally comprised all of Utah and seven counties of Nevada, was established as a Vicariate-Apostolic on Nov. 23, 1886, and was erected a diocese on Jan. 27, 1891. Last year, by Apostolic Constitution, dated March 27, 1931, the Nevada section was separated from the Salt Lake diocese and incorporated in the new Reno diocese.
Diocese Large in Area
The diocese of Salt Lake has an area of 84,990 square miles, and is more than eighteen times as large as the archdiocese of New York. However, the diocese is sparsely settled and the Catholics are few in number. A census taken up last year gives the Catholic population of the diocese of Salt Lake as 19,217.

Catholic Colleges, South India, Give Religious Exams

Mangalore (South India)—With the purpose of securing a greater attention to the teaching and study of Religion in the Catholic Colleges of South India, the Catholic Educational Council of the Madras Presidency inaugurated four years ago a project of Inter-Collegiate Examination in Religion, touching especially the subjects of Apologetics and Christian Doctrine. The experiment has proved a great success. Eight out of 31 Colleges of South India this year sent up 517 candidates. At the first examination, four years ago, only 137 candidates participated.
