An outstanding example of persistent effort is furnished by John Connelly, a Chicago Catholic Layman...

His estimate is that he has distributed in the last ten years in the neighborhood of 750,000 copies of publications which have been placed where they would be read by persons who otherwise might not have an opportunity to see a Catholic newspaper or magazine.

In the decade, according to Mr. Connelly, he has gathered 288,000 copies of publications from the offices of weekly publications, has picked up 144,000 copies of papers from three large churches, and has received 240,000 copies through the Knights of Columbus...

For nine years Mr. Connelly carried on this work alone, visiting the different churches, offices and other places to obtain the publications, and seeing personally to their distribution. During the past year, however, three volunteers have been helping him.

Mr. Connelly began his extraordinary work with a few copies of a paper which were sent to a reformatory. He received a letter from an inmate who was so grateful for the literature that Mr. Connelly decided to continue the distribution regularly.

Pilgrimage from Here to Auriesville Will Reach Shrine in Time for Mass

The Pilgrimage on Sunday, August 28, in honor of Kateri Tekakwitha, patroness of the Rochester Diocese, will reach the Shrine of the North American Martyrs at Auriesville in time for Mass at eleven o'clock.

Mass will be celebrated in the new Coliseum, which was dedicated a year ago last June. The diameter of the Coliseum is 257 feet. It is divided into eight sections, one section for each of the martyrs. On each side of the main entrance are engraved on the medallions are sacred tombs and palms of victory above which is a cross and below the name of the saint in whose honor the section is dedicated.

In arches above the double doors, are niches containing Carrara marble statues of the saints, one to each section. To the right of the Saint Isaac Jogues entrance is the "Glorification" laid September 28, 1830, also engraved with the tomahawk and palm design.

The seating capacity is 6,500, and it is estimated that the use of standing room space will raise the number to a maximum capacity of more than 10,000 pilgrims.

Four gates at the end of the main aisles lead to the circular sanctuary, with a diameter of 72 feet. The four altars in the center, facing in different directions, are dedicated to Our Lady of Marys, St. Isaac Jogues, St. Rene Goupil and St. John Lalande. Enclosing the altars is the sanctuary rail sufficiently large to allow 200 communicants to kneel at one time.

On each altar there are three octagonal panels of oak carved from a tree which stood on the shrine site, then the Lower Castle of the Mohawk Indians, at the time of the martyrdom of St. Rene Goupil and of St. Isaac Jogues and St. John Lalande in 1645. The background of the altar is formed by a heavy paneled wall of white pine and hemlock grown on the shrine grounds.

The carved crosses in these panels recall the practice of St. Isaac Jogues and the servant of God, Kateri Tekakwitha.

The society is located in the enclosure formed by the background of the altars. Within the center support is a reinforced concrete vault in which are kept the sacred vessels and relics of the martyrs. A stairway leads to the upper platform.

A second tier of pinnacles forms the background for this platform.
