Winnipeg Catholic Schools Closed By Archbishop

Winnipeg School Board estimates each pupil costs the city \$50 a year in the public schools. Archbishop Sinnott's letter to Mayor Webb, in part, follows: "Your Worship it is my painful duty to announce to you that the end of the current year we shall be compelled to close the parochial schools, which for more than 40 years have been carried on in connection with the Catholic parishes of Winnipeg."

His Excellency pointed out that each of these parochial schools had been conducted entirely and exactly along the lines of the Winnipeg public school board.

W. R. Milton, chairman of the Winnipeg School Board, announced room would have to be found in public schools for the pupils now attending Catholic schools.

A report that Archbishop Sinnott had offered to compromise if the city would pay \$60,000, "is absolutely without foundation," Rev. Father R. Neary, stated today.

In the same archdiocese, but in different localities, Catholic public schools are conducted at public expense, the Sisters receiving, in accordance with their own wishes, a much lower salary than is given lay teachers.
