(N. C. W. C. News Service) Brooklyn, N. Y.—If Russia is recognized, President Roosevelt will assassinate the spirit of his inaugural address, it is declared in an article entitled "Roosevelt and Russia," in the current issue of The Monthly Messenger, published under the direction of the Redemptorist Fathers in the Parish of Our Lady of Perpetual Help.
