Within The Law Radio Talk Given by The Rev. William J. Mahoney, C. L., J. C. D., Over Station WHAM, Sunday, May 7

Last week we endeavored to prove that Ethics is a science of right living. Right living connotes living according to a certain rule of righteousness or law.

In the beginning light was made. In the beginning law was made. God breathed upon unorganized nothingness and in—there came forth an ordered reality.

It is all too true that man can disobey this law. He alone of all creatures can sound a note of discord in the grand symphony of the universe.

Man chooses to run counter to the Imperious dictates of his rational nature. It is un-natural. It is against reason.

He who would deny the existence of the natural law must be prepared to defend the following facts. First is that the supremacy of jurisdiction of the all-creating God embraces all creatures save man.

The natural law is an emanation of the eternal law—designed specifically for rational nature. The natural law is an expression of the will of nature's Author ordaining the life and actions of man as man.

And there are many even in this enlightened day who believe that it is the terrifying thought of an avenged, avenging God that thwarts most successfully the immoral and anti-social impulses of men.
