How and What To Serve

Hints For the Housewife By Molly Gavin The June Bride of this year is probably in the throes of furnishing her home to be so that she may keep house and cook and serve meals properly.

- Aluminum Ware 1 double boiler 3 saucepans, assorted sizes 2 pans, assorted sizes, 2 and 4 qt. 1 griddle 2 muffin pans (12 each) 1 round cake pan with loosening bars for removing cakes 1 flour dredger 1 pitcher 1 large baking pan 1 omelet pan 1 milk and cream dipper 1 tinware 2 pie tins 1 bread box

- Crockery 1 set of 3 mixing bowls, white or yellow, assorted sizes 6 ramekins 1 teapot 1 Small Kitchen Utensils 1 can opener 1 ice pick 1 food chopper 3 funnels 1 rolling pin 1 colander 1 pan cake turner 1 wire broiler

- doughnut or frying basket planks for meat and fish 1 sink strainer measuring cups Shrimp and Pineapple Salad Remove shrimps from can, cover with cold or ice water, and let stand 20 minutes. Drain, dry between towels, remove intestinal veins and arrange about four shrimps on a slice of pineapple on a crisp lettuce leaf. Put a spoonful of mayonnaise dressing on each and garnish with a stuffed olive cut in quarters.

- Maid of the Middy Pie 12 Graham crackers 1 tpb. sugar 1 cup sugar 1 lemon 1-3 cup butter 3 egg yolks pinch of salt 3 egg whites Roll or crumble crackers fine and mix with softened butter and sugar. Butter pie pan and press mixture firmly with fingers against bottom and sides.

- Then beat egg yolks and combine with 1-2 cup sugar. Add juice of lemon and grated rind and salt. Stir over hot water until thick. Add stiffly beaten egg whites to the other 1-2 cup sugar. Fold into the lemon custard. Turn into crumpled pan and bake for 25 minutes in a slow oven.

- Economy Pudding 1 cup milk 4 tps. baking powder 1-4 cup butter 1 cup cooked prunes 20 soda crackers 2-4 cup brown sugar 1-2 tsp. salt 1-2 tsp. cinnamon 1-2 tsp. vanilla Crumble crackers and add milk. Let soak about five minutes. Mix sugar, salt, cinnamon and baking powder and add to cracker mixture. Add melted butter, prunes and vanilla, and mix well. Butter mould and turn mixture into it. Steam over hot water from one to one and one-half hours. Serve warm with hard sauce.

He dwelt upon the need of making the study club work practical insofar as it is concerned with the study of religion. He emphasized the necessity of having a spiritual moderator who would direct the study, and also the advisability of seeing that the results were put to practical account by the use of either the written or spoken word.

During a recent visit to Italy our National Executive Secretary, Miss Agnes G. Regan, had the happy privilege of paying a visit to the Shrine of Our Lady of Good Counsel.

The Shrine where the miraculous picture has been preserved for many centuries is in the little town of Guasanzano about forty miles from Rome. The Church is in charge of the Augustinians. It is situated on the top of a high hill. The quaint little Italian houses are clustered so closely about it that from the valley below one gets the impression of

some curious mass formation rather than individual habitations. On all of the important feasts of Our Blessed Mother, pilgrimages are made not only from the surrounding country but from many distant places and thousands come to pay homage to Our Lady.

Arrangements were made with the good priest in charge to have a "Novena of Masses" offered in honor of Our Lady of Good Counsel for the National Council of Catholic Women asking that Our Lady smile not only the Council as a whole but each of its members in the great work in which it is pledged.
