## IMPRESSIVE FINAL TRIBUTE ACCORDED BISHOP O'HERN

### BISHOP O'HERN'S KEEN SENSE OF DUTY CONSTANT DECLARES BISHOP WALSH IN EULOGY

"He was the representative of Jesus Christ who reduced all law to the law of Charity and so he was impelled to spend himself for the love of others," said the Most Rev. Emmet M. Walsh, Bishop of Charleston, S. C., in his eulogy of the late Bishop John Francis O'Hern at the conclusion of the Solemn Funeral Mass in St. Patrick's Cathedral Friday.

Knowing Bishop O'Hern intimately, Bishop Walsh who is a graduate of St. Bernard's Seminary, paid tender and sincere tribute to the deceased prelate. The complete text of the sermon is as follows:

"It was a little more than four years ago that the walls of this old Cathedral looked down upon a great gathering of Bishops, priests and people presided over by a Cardinal of Holy Church. It was a joyous occasion reflected in the smiling faces of all. And this old church vibrated with the enthusiasm of hearts united by affectionate esteem for him whom the Holy Father of Christendom had chosen to be their shepherd. It was fitting that His Eminence presiding was one called in his own city the 'Cardinal of Charity.'

"For John Francis O'Hern, who was being consecrated the Third Bishop of Rochester, was a man they loved for his greatest virtue—that greatest of divine virtues—Charity. As a rector of the Cathedral parish, as pastor of Corpus Christi parish and Vicar General of the diocese, he had known but one law, in which all other laws were comprised: 'Thou

shalt love the Lord thy God with thy whole heart, with thy whole soul and with thy whole mind. And thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself. His motto was but the summary of what his priestly life had been, and what his episcopal life could only be—'Servire regnare est'—To serve is to reign.

"You were here that day, happy and joyous at the exaltation of him

### THROUGH GREETS PAPAL DELEGATE IN WASHINGTON

### Archbishop Cicognani Addresses Nation by Radio at Catholic U. Ceremonies

(By N.C.W.C. News Service)

Washington—Speaking to the entire nation through a radio hook-up arranged for his formal welcome at the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception on the campus of the Catholic University of America here Sunday afternoon, His Excellency the Most Rev. Amleto Giovanni Cicognani, Apostolic Delegate to the United States, repeated the message to the Bishops, priests and people of the diocese entrusted to him by His Holiness Pope Pius XI at a private audience which preceded his departure from Rome.

Following the formal welcome in the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, at which His Excellency gave the radio address, a reception was held in the Mullen Library on the University campus. There, with the assistance of the Rt. Rev. Msgr. James H. Ryan, Rector of the University, and of the Very Rev. Msgr. Paul Marrella, Auditor of the Apostolic Delegation, His Excellency met approximately a thousand persons, among them many members of the diplomatic corps, senators and representatives, leaders in the national life, prominent officers of the army and navy, representatives of various religious Orders, members of the faculty of the Catholic University, and distinguished figures in the social life of the National Capital.

The welcome extended to the Apostolic Delegate by Monsignor Ryan, speaking in his own name and in the name of the faculty and student body of the University, also was broadcast.

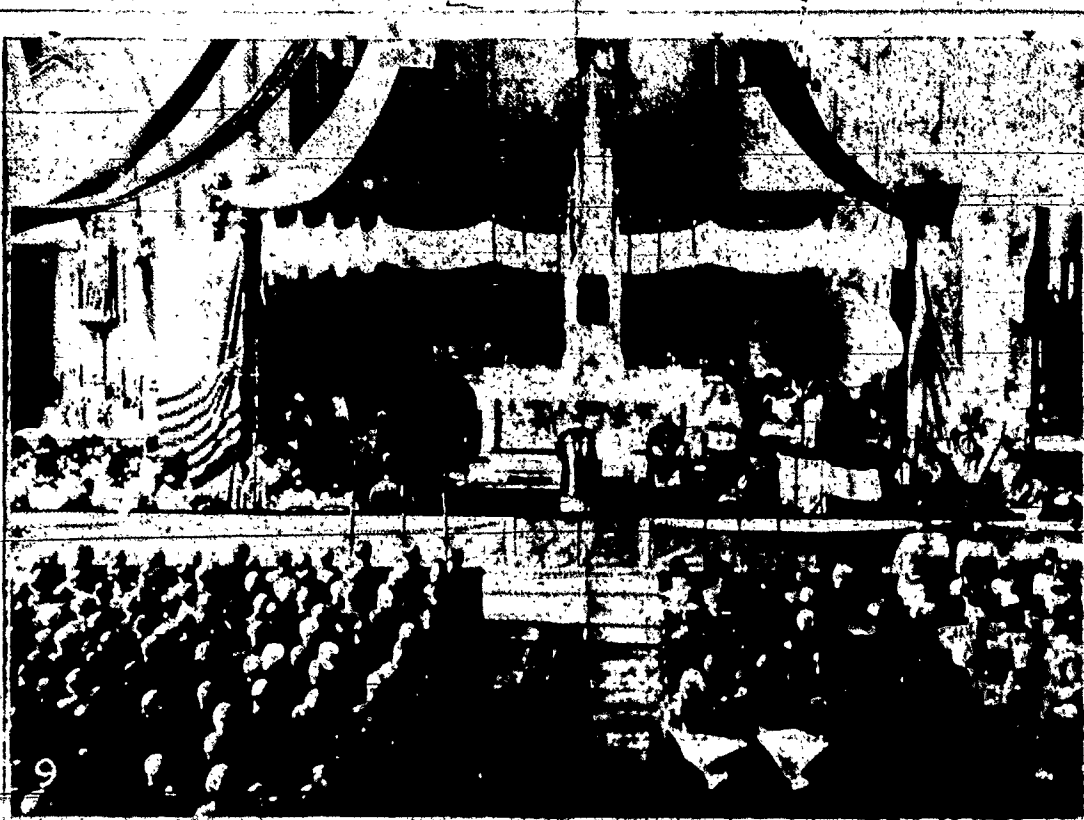

### HOLY NAME MEN PLAN TRIBUTE TO BISHOP O'HERN

### Will Offer Holy Communion On June 11 and Conduct Rally As Memorial

### BISHOP WALSH TO OFFICIATE AT ORDINATION

### 11 Young Men for Rochester Diocese To Receive Holy Orders Sat., June 10

Ordination of the 1933 class at St. Bernard's Seminary will take place at St. Patrick's Cathedral, Saturday morning, June 10, with the Most Rev. Emmet M. Walsh, D. D., Bishop of Charleston, officiating. It is announced by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. William M. Hart, Vicar Capitular of the diocese.

### POPE PIUS SENDS CONDOLENCES ON BISHOP'S DEATH

### Refers To Bishop O'Hern as Worthy Bishop; Expresses Sorrow To Diocese

Among the great number of tributes to the Most Rev. John Francis O'Hern, third Bishop of Rochester, received following his death last week was one from His Holiness, Pope Pius XI.

In a cable sent to the Rt. Rev. Msgr. William M. Hart, Vicar Capitular through Eugene Cardinal Pacelli, Papal Secretary of State, the Holy Father's message was as follows:

"The august Pontiff, deeply deploring the death of the most worthy Bishop, expresses to the Consultors and to the Diocese his feelings of sorrow; and while praying for eternal rest for the deceased, lovingly imports to you his blessing."

From President Franklin D. Roosevelt who had had a happy meeting with Bishop O'Hern on the occasion of the 100th anniversary of Our Mother of Sorrows Church, Mt. Read Boulevard, came the following wire to Monsignor Hart:

"Deeply distressed to learn of the passing of my old friend, and his death is a very great loss to Western New York."

Former Governor Alfred E. Smith sent the following message: "Deeply grieved at the death of Bishop O'Hern. Sincere sympathy to all the people of his diocese."

Telegrams and messages of condolences included those from Pietro Cardinal Fumasoni-Biondi, Rome, Prefect of the Society of the Propagation of the Faith, and former Apostolic Delegate to the United States; Governor Herbert H. Lehman of Albany and many other distinguished prelates and citizens of the country.

Mayor Percival D. Oviatt issued a proclamation Friday decreeing a one-minute period of silence and the flying of flags at half-staff in tribute to the memory of the beloved head of the Catholic diocese in Rochester.
