Schools Press Relations Course To Be Given At Catholic U. In Summer

Washington, D. C.—What the public wants to know about schools and the way teachers and school administrators can tell their story through the daily and weekly press, will be the subject of a course to be given this summer at the Catholic University of America, Washington, D. C. This course, An Introduction to Press Relations for Schools, will consider ways and means for the development of effective relations with the press and other agencies for the dissemination of news. In the development of a program of extra-curricular activities to create additional local interest in the school, this class will include instruction and practice in the details of preparing news releases and in the formation of a "morgue".

The Holy Father's discourse was in reply to an address of Cardinal Fumasoni Biondi, Prefect of the Propaganda, who introduced the National Directors and expressed the homage of all present. He pointed out that the collections for the Propagation of the Faith this year, though suffering from substantial decreases in a few countries, have been maintained almost at the level of last year due to increases reported by others. One very consoling feature of this year's report is the important gains of Propagation collections in mission countries of Asia, Africa and the Pacific Islands.
