Fr. McGuire Writes of Conditions Found in China Missions

The Rev. Frederick McGuire, C.M., now located in the Catholic Mission, Kanchow, Kiangsi, China, in a letter just received by the Rev. Eugene J. Hudson describes conditions in the Vincentian Fathers' missions in China.

"Paganism is all around us and weighs upon one's soul but the Christians live normal Christian lives despite the hardships encountered in so living. We have the good and the bad and the indifferent. Just as present in this, the main mission, there is peace. The fields are somewhat to the north of us. Word came yesterday that 10,000 of them were about 35 miles Northeast of here. That has not been confirmed.

"We feel safe here due to the presence of soldiers. Very few of our outside missions can be staffed, however, due to the presence of local loots. Here we have 1,700 refugees whom we feed and instruct in the doctrine every day. The poor creatures would starve if we did not do this. 170 catechumens will be baptized next week. Father Williams and I are plugging away at the language and it is no easy task.
