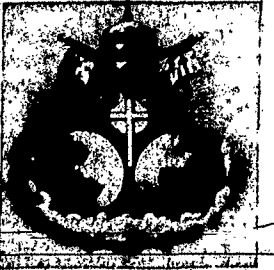

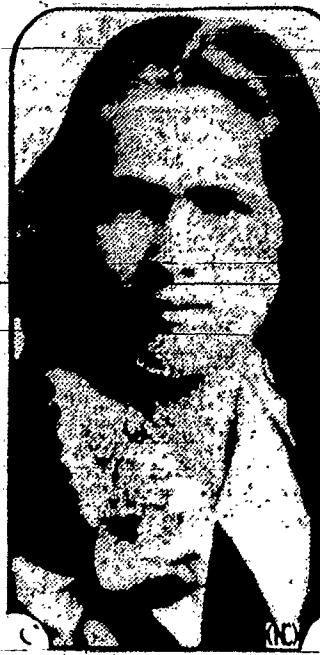

900 SODALISTS DELEGATES AT CONVENTION

(Continued from Page 1) passed a resolution urging the 2,000,000 Sodalists of the United States to sign the petition which the Sodality officials will present at Rome to the effect that "the traditional belief of the faithful from apostolic times that the Mother of God after her death and burial was honored by the special privilege of having her incorrupt body and soul reunited and both assumed into heaven" be declared a defined dogma for the Universal Church.

The General Sessions of the Convention were presided over by Rev. Daniel A. Lord, S.J., national director of the Sodality, and Rev. J. Joseph Lyons, S.J., Assistant National Director. Sectional meetings of the men were under the direction of Rev. George A. McDonald, S.J., and the women's section was directed by Miss Dorothy J. Willmann, Executive Secretary of the Parish Sodalities.

London.—(NCWC)—Mass has just been offered once more, for the first time since the Reformation, in a fourteenth century church at Shore, Kent. After the Reformation, Queen Elizabeth sold the building to two laymen and it has since been used for a number of purposes.

Trim the end of an old whisk broom to a V-shaped point; it will be found excellent for cleaning corners of rooms, stairs, etc. Flour sacks can be used for many purposes.
