New Orleans—(NCWC)—Mr. John T. Linehan, S.J., a scholastic attached to the faculty of the Jesuit High School here, has volunteered for service on the Trincoll Mission in Ceylon, and will go to that post with the understanding that it is to be his life work.

Fribourg, Switzerland—(NCWC)—Peter Conway, 16-year-old American who has been a student for two years at Villa Saint Jean, conducted by the Society of Mary, an academy which prepares candidates for the French Government degrees, returned from his written and oral examinations for the baccalaureate at Besancon, France, with the distinction of having received the best note in French and of being among the three with the highest general average in the group of over 300 competitors, the majority of whom are native Frenchmen.

San Francisco—(NCWC)—More than 100,000 pilgrims and members of Catholic organizations marched in the impressive annual open air procession of the Most Blessed Sacrament around the new \$350,000 Basilica of St. Anne here Sunday of last week. The ceremony, held during the novena to St. Anne, was headed by the Most Rev. Edward J. Hanna, Archbishop of San Francisco, who carried the Host under a cloth of gold canopy.

Cape Town—(NCWC)—The Dominican Sisters have crowned a half century spent in the service of the deaf in South Africa by erecting an imposing building in Cape Town to be known as the Dominican School for the Deaf.

Lille, France—(Fides)—This year, for the eighth time, the University of Lille will hold a six weeks course in medicine for missionaries. The course, enrollment in which is gratis, extends from September 4 to October 15 and is open to all missionaries and mission workers.

Immaculate Conception Auxiliary, No. 160

Auxiliary No. 160, Knights of St. John was organized December 2, 1912 with fifty charter members. At their first meeting a charter was granted, and was signed by the first officers of the auxiliary as follows: Spiritual Director, the Rev. A. M. O'Neil; President, Mary Boelig; First Vice-President, Lillian Rhinehardt; Second Vice-President, Anna Quinn; Recording and Corresponding Secretary, Josephine Blackwood; Financial Secretary, Fanny Growley; Treasurer, Lina Ryan; Trustees, Magdalena Blackwood, Ester O'Kane, Amelia Hewitt, Catherine Rice and Johanna Hyland. These officers were installed by Supreme President, Mrs. Teresa Renner.

This auxiliary existed for many years guided by these officers and later, Mrs. Josephine Blackwood was elected to serve as President. She served until June 1931 at which time the Auxiliary reorganized with ten charter members and about fifty new members. Mrs. Anna Lamphorn, Deputy Organizer and Supreme President Mrs. Teresa Renner Ganster were installing officers.

The new officers elected in 1931 were President, Mrs. Katharine Scheer; First Vice-President, Mrs. Jennie Falls; Second Vice-President, Mrs. Alma Predmore; Recording Secretary, Miss Mollie Dolan; Financial Secretary, Miss Mary Ellen Lally; and Treasurer, Mrs. Gertrude Bernard.

National Social Welfare Leaders To Confer In N. Y.

(Continued from Page 1) of New York City; William Hodson, President of the National Conference of Social Work, and United States Senator Robert F. Wagner.

The Committee on Families will deal with relief programs under the auspices of public and private agencies in the field of social welfare. This section will consider present day trends in family case work as affecting family life in America. The Committee on Children will discuss utilization of public and private agencies in the Catholic program of child care. Other meetings of the Children's section will deal with plans for dependent adolescents. Among the speakers will be Rev. G. H. LeBlond, Director of Catholic Charities, Cleveland. Father LeBlond, whose selection as Bishop of St. Joseph, Missouri, has just been announced, has supervised the formation of program material in the health section of the Conference.

Plan Diocesan Programs The division of mental health will consider ways and means for setting up diocesan programs of mental hygiene. The division on physical health proposes to investigate recent trends in hospital social service activities.

The section meetings of Committee on Protective Care will be devoted to discussion of the entire group of case work techniques involved in systems of probation and parole. Special emphasis will be given to the indirect case work relating to the development of volunteer effort in the field of protective care. The deliberations of the Committee on Social and Economic Problems will be centered on present day economic objectives to include unemployment insurance, old age pensions and low-priced housing projects.

Home—(Fides)—The Rev. Louis Paly, O.P., Swiss missionary of the Prefecture Apostolic of Tingchow, Fukien Province, China, has been taken by bandits, says a Fides telegram from Hongkong. Tingchow is mission territory of the German Province of Dominicans. Father Paly was taken captive at Shanghang, center of the "Soviet Republic of Western Fukien," as the 12th Red Army calls the territory over which it dominates.

Diocesan-Wide Effort To Be Made To Increase Readers of Courier

Charles A. Tucker, Prominent Catholic Lay Leader, To Direct Activity for Developing Reader Interest for Official Newspaper of Rochester Diocese

With the approval and encouragement of the Rt. Rev. Msgr. William M. Hart, Vicar Capitular of the Diocese of Rochester, a well planned effort to increase the friends and subscribers to the Catholic Courier, official diocesan newspaper, will be launched in the parishes of the diocese within a few days.

A little over a year ago, our late beloved Bishop O'Hern took over the control of the Catholic Courier and under his direction the Rev. Leo C. Mooney was placed in active charge of the newspaper. Offices have been established in the Columbus Civic Center. A new typographical press throughout was given the physical appearance of the paper and a capable editorial staff organized. The newspaper is now, in fact, a diocesan organ and an effort is being made weekly to make it more interesting and readable.

To direct the activity necessary for increasing readers of the Catholic Courier, Charles A. Tucker, prominent Catholic layman, has been appointed Circulation Manager. Mr. Tucker is Chancellor of Rochester Council, Knights of Columbus; Secretary, Rochester Diocesan Council, National Council of Catholic Men; active in the Laymen's Retreat League and the Rochester Nocturnal Adoration Society and had a prominent part in the foundation of Nocturnal Adoration Societies throughout the diocese. He is a member of St. Andrew's parish.

In the course of the next few weeks, Mr. Tucker, following up a recent letter sent out by Monsignor Hart, urging support of the Catholic Courier, will call on the pastors personally and outline the new plans. The program will be as follows:
