"The Church knows best. It knows best where money should be spent. It sees clearest the needs of missionaries who might never be known to us. It can rush quickest into points of peril the money that will keep missions from falling into ruin. Its tireless, all-seeing eye is on every mission and missionary, and its generous hand is held out with precisely the help needed."

"So we know that our first missionary duty is to the Church's own missionary society."

Three fields stressed by those in charge of promoting Mission Sunday throughout the United States are, according to an N. C. W. C. News Service dispatch, as follows:

First, missionary activity is not confined to foreign lands, but is going on in the United States as well. The American Board of Catholic Missions is supporting thousands of priests and keeping open hundreds of Catholic churches in America. In the sparsely settled centers of the country, Catholics are few in number and their pastors are forced to depend upon the assistance that they receive from the American Board of Catholic Missions.

Second, American priests are found in every section of the mission field—in foreign countries spending themselves years after year for the salvation of souls. These men depend for their support on the Society for the Propagation of the Faith.

Third, there are other priests who are striving to bring back to the Church millions whose ancestors were turned away by politics and by racial antagonisms. These people are found in the Near East. The priests working for these people depend for their support on the Catholic Near East Welfare Association.

The collection on Sunday October 29 is for all these societies. Forty per cent is reserved for the missions in the United States; 15 per cent of the remainder is given to the Catholic Near East Welfare Association; and the rest to the Society for the Propagation of the Faith.

Rochester Priest Offers New Drama About Fr. Damien
 "The Lone Volunteer of Molokai," a mission drama in three acts by Reiner Yaeh has been translated into English by the Rev. L. W. Jourissen, C.S.S.C., assistant pastor of Our Lady of Victory Church and has just been announced this week.

For one year, Father Jourissen has been working to prepare this play for presentation in English. The play has been reviewed by Mrs. Lois D. McGrady of this city and is now ready for presentation by groups upon the payment of a royalty. Single copies are 75 cents each. All proceeds from the publication of the play will go toward the promotion of Father Damien's cause for canonization.

The action of the play takes place in Molokai in December, 1888, four months before the death of Father Damien. The characters are: Father Damien, the hero of Molokai; Ira Joseph Dutton; Edward Clifford; Francis, a sailor; Daniel (Father Damien's boy, a leper); Ioane Rat Eater, (a Hawaiian, another leper); Lam-Kai Oo (a Chinese leper).

Guided by priests of the English, Irish and Scottish Colleges, they made rapid visits all over the city. Many of the men included in their tour places and things of special interest according to their trades. Engineers passed critical eyes over the large engineering works carried out in Rome in recent years; road-makers inspected the great new thoroughfares constructed by order of Premier Mussolini; the coal-miners, of course, hurried out to the Catacombs to cast a professional eye over the work of the Early Christian excavators.

But the pilgrimage spirit was dominant throughout, and the audience which the Sovereign Pontiff granted to the pilgrims totally eclipsed all else.

The pilgrims have come home, their hearts filled with joy at the Holy Father's greeting and the lasting hope and consolation he infused into them.
