ARCHBISHOP MOONEY OFFICIATES AT ANNUAL BLESSING OF GRAVES

Prayers for the souls of the faithful departed and especially for those whose bodies lie in Holy Sepulchre Cemetery were offered last Sunday in the solemn ceremony of the Blessing of the Graves in which Archbishop Edward Mooney, D.D. officiated for the first time in cope and mitre in head of the diocese.
With more than 5,000 of the laity, respectful, reverence, Archbishop Mooney preceded by Knights of St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's seminaries and escorted by Monsignori and priests of the diocese walked through the avenues of the cemetery sprinkling holy water while the choir of students chanted the litany of the dead.
Accompanying the Archbishop were: The Rt. Rev. William M. Hart, vicar general; the Rt. Rev. John F. Boppel, chancellor; the Rt. Rev. James J. Hartley, P.A.; the Rt. Rev. Charles F. Shay, the Rt. Rev. George V. Burns, the Rt. Rev. Joseph S. Cameron, the Rt. Rev. John P. Brophy and the Rt. Rev. J. Francis Goggin.
Starting at St. Bernard's Seminary, the procession proceeded to All Souls' Mortuary Chapel, east side of the cemetery in which lie the remains of Bishop McQuaid and Bishop O'Hern. Vespers of the dead were sung and special prayers recited for the two former Bishops of the diocese.
After going throughout the cemetery blessing the graves, the ecclesiastical procession returned to the cemetery chapel where Archbishop Mooney mounted the temporary platform in front of the chapel and addressed those present.
"Dwelling upon the doctrine of the Communion of Saints the Archbishop spoke of the importance of praying for the souls of the faithful departed and of asking those of the Church suffering to intercede for the Church Militant.
The Archbishop spoke of the transitory character of all things human, wealth and honors, which stop at the grave. If all accept the sacred trust imposed upon them and are faithful to God they will leave this life rich in God's graces, whether they have been rich or poor in life. The consolation in the passing of a loved one, he said, comes from the feeling that those going into their graves have been faithful to God.
