**NEW BISHOP'S  
 CAREER HAS  
 TAKEN HIM FAR**

 Archdiocese of Rochester, N. Y., was selected as its head and served until the death of Bishop Farrelly and the appointment of Bishop Schrembs. Bishop Schrembs made a change in the teaching staff of the school to the priests and brothers of the Society of Mary.

**First Appointment**  
 After serving some time as pastor of St. Patrick's Church, Youngtown, the priest who was to become the first American to receive a permanent appointment to the diplomatic service of the Holy See was selected to become Spiritual Director of the North American College in Rome. Bishop Schrembs released Dr. Mooney from his pastoral duties to accept the new appointment and he took up his office in Rome in 1923.

In 1926, while still the Spiritual Director of the North American College and while only 43 years of age, Father Mooney was named Apostolic Delegate to India and was consecrated on January 31, 1926 titular Archbishop of Ironopolis by Cardinal Van Rossum, then Prefect of the Sacred Congregation for the Propagation of the Faith.

During the five years that he held the very important post of Apostolic Delegate to India, Archbishop Mooney endeared himself to the hearts of Indian Catholics and there was genuine sorrow among them when, in 1931, he was transferred to be Apostolic Delegate to Japan. While Archbishop Mooney was Apostolic Delegate to India, eleven new mission territories were erected and three more sees were entrusted to the direction of native Indian Bishops.

One of the most outstanding accomplishments while Archbishop Mooney was Apostolic Delegate to India was the settlement of the so-called "double jurisdiction" question which was effected through an accord between the Holy See and Portugal. The question of "double jurisdiction" involved scattered parishes of Portuguese origin along the eastern coast of India. Before the accord, these parishes owed allegiance to the original Portuguese dioceses sometimes far distant, but after the settlement they came under the local Ordinary in whose territory they were located.

Also during the term of Archbishop Mooney's service in India, Catholics of that country presented a new residence to the Apostolic Delegate as a Jubilee Gift to His Holiness Pope Pius XI.

**Endeared to Japanese**  
 Taking up his duties in Japan, Archbishop Mooney quickly endeared himself to the Catholics of that country, and his first visitation was marked by enthusiastic receptions by the faithful. In an interview granted four months ago in Rome, Archbishop Mooney declared that the progress of the spread of the Catholic Faith in Japan is solid, though the results are not spectacular.

"Striking beauty of soul is found among the Japanese people," he said. "Our missionaries never tire of speaking of the spiritual depth which they discover in so many who seek out the priest, attracted by the sublimity of our Christian heritage." "Silently, humbly," he continued, "the Church's messengers are winning their way in Japan. Catholic schools, each one brought to a high standard of excellence, are already thirty numerous. Hospital beginnings in medical and social work give promise of results in this demonstration of Christian charity."

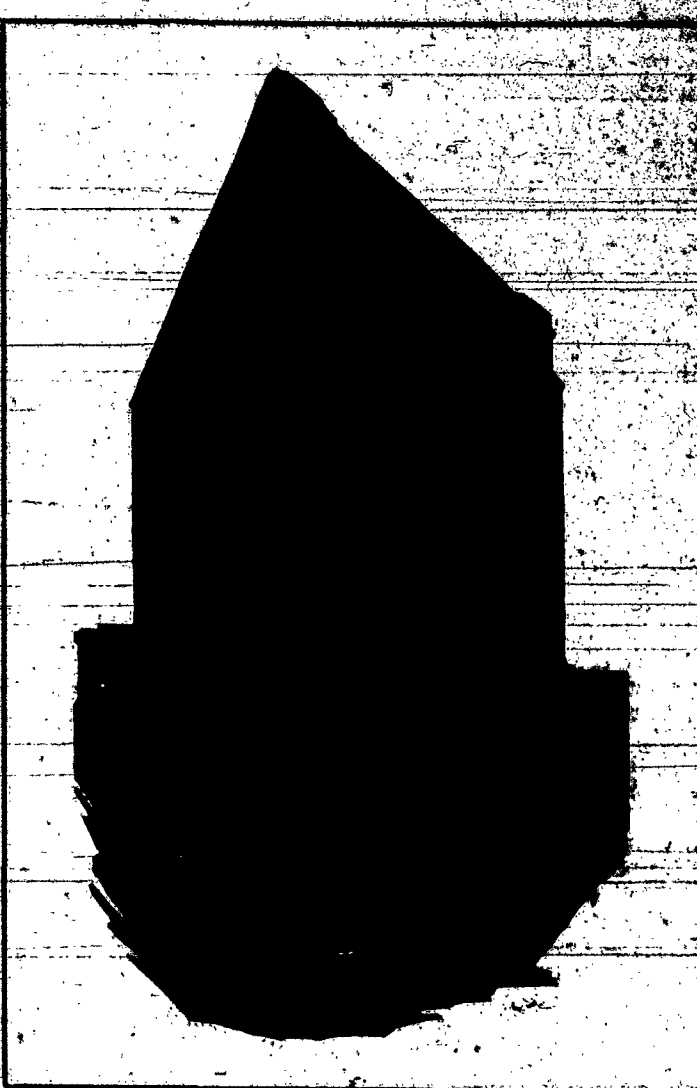
Apostolic Delegate to India in 1926, Archbishop Mooney visited the United States to visit his aged mother, Mrs. Sara Mooney, since deceased, and celebrated a solemn Pontifical Mass in St. Columba's church, his home parish in Youngstown.

Earlier this year, while en route from his post at Tokyo to Rome, Archbishop Mooney crossed the United States, and during a visit in Washington, was guest at luncheon of Kazuo Dozaki, Ambassador of Japan to the United States. Ending the term of his installation in Rochester, Archbishop Mooney spent the time between his

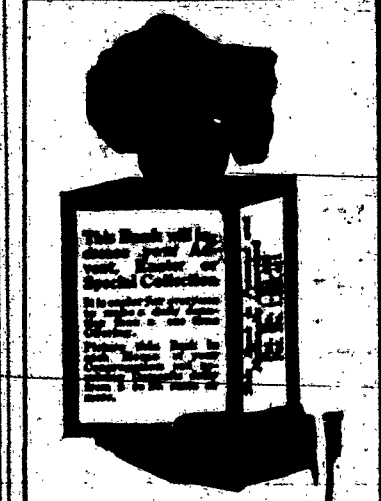

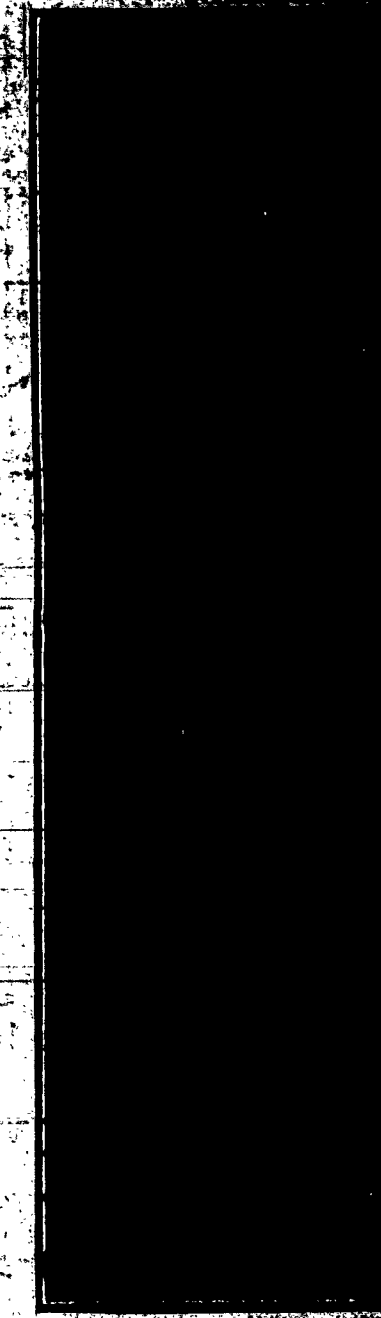
