(Continued from Page 11) The Pastor of your souls, and showing him due honor, so that he may rejoice to find in you devoted children and you may rejoice to find in him a benevolent father. We desire and direct that through the care and attention of the Ordinary who now rules your diocese, this letter of Ours be publicly read in the Cathedral Church from the pulpit on the first feast day of precept for the people after the receipt of this letter. Given at St. Peter's in Rome in the Year of Our Lord, one thousand nine hundred thirty-three, the twenty-eighth day of the month of August, the twelfth year of Our Pontificate—Anno Sancto.

Letter to Archbishop Plus bishop servant of the servants of God. To our venerable brother, Edward Mooney, heretofore, titular archbishop of Irenopolis in Isauria. Archbishop-elect of Rochester in America. Health and apostolic benediction.

The office of the supreme apostolate committed by the Eternal Prince of Pastors to Our humble person, whereby We rule over the whole Christian world, imposes on Us the duty of providing most diligently for the appointment to all Churches of such Prelates as will have the knowledge and power to nurture, rule and govern beneficially the flock of the Lord entrusted to them.

Therefore, as the Cathedral Church of Rochester in America, suffragan of the Metropolitan Church of New York, is at present without a pastor because of the death of Bishop John Francis O'Hern of blessed memory, We release you from the bond of the Archiepiscopal Church of Irenopolis whose title you have borne up to the present and We transfer you to that Cathedral Church of Rochester and make you Bishop and Pastor over it, and We commit fully to you the care, government and administration of the same Church in things spiritual and things temporal, with all the rights and privileges, the duties and obligations belonging to this pastoral office, on the advice of Our Venerable Brothers the Cardinals of the Holy Roman Church and by virtue of the fullness of Our apostolical power.

In order, however, that you may not lose the Archiepiscopal title and dignity in transferring to this Episcopal See, We grant you the right to retain for the future also the Archiepiscopal title and therefore to be called Archbishop-Bishop of Rochester in America. We will and direct that after you have fulfilled the other requirements of law, you shall be required before taking canonical possession of the Diocese confided to you to make profession of Catholic faith and to take the usual oath of fidelity according to the established forms in presence of any Catholic Bishop you may choose who is in favor and communion with the Holy See, and to send the forms of the same signed by you and the aforesaid Bishop and marked with the seal as soon as possible to the Apostolic Chancery.

Msgr. Hart Address At Installation

Hear O Lord, the wishes of this people that everyone that enters this edifice to worship may rejoice to receive Thy blessing.

How the hearts of our people rejoice today as they assist at the solemn rite of installation of the new archbishop-bishop of Rochester, Most Rev. Edward Mooney. Their prayer and in all the days to come shall be that God's choicest blessings may descend upon him to make fruitful his ministry unto the development of the Church of God and the salvation of immortal souls. Thirty-five years ago this time, the archbishop of New York sat in this sanctuary presiding at the consecration of this Cathedral. After 28 years as bishop of Rochester, Bernard McQuaid had completed the reconstruction of the cathedral, and called to his episcopal city prelates and clergy from far and wide to assist at its consecration.

The ravages of time and the growth of the diocese had made it evident that the old structure could no longer serve; and willing hands were raised in support of the bishop as he undertook the work of reconstruction that has been a mark of the growth of the Church since the beginning.

Canon Greg. Cox The material elements fail; but the work of the Church goes on. The human element passes from the scene but the Church continues to advance and to minister to the souls of men. The fullness of the priesthood of Jesus Christ that dwelt in the first Apostles has been handed down in the Sacrament of Holy Orders. The newer generation receives from the passing generation the power and the glory of the priesthood in the laying on of hands.

The Church is a living society: "Behold, I am with you even to the consummation of the world." She continues to live in her unity as a creation of God; she continues to live in her members, those passing through the gates of death in the means of entering on the life everlasting.

In this faith and in this realization of hope do we shorten our time of mourning for our departed leader, the beloved Bishop O'Hern: We know the work he has done; we know that the Lord has called him from the labors of the world that he may enter on the reward that God has prepared for those that love Him.

We see in the new leader whom the Holy Father has sent to the diocese of Rochester one who will follow in the footsteps of his noble, illustrious predecessors: One who will carry on the great work so auspiciously inaugurated and developed by the three noble prelates who in the 65 years of the existence of this diocese have made a name for themselves that shall never die.

To Archbishop Mooney, I would pledge this morning the love and devotion, the loyalty and service of a consecrated body of priests, and the unquestioning fidelity and support of a laity imbued with the Faith of Jesus Christ.

The zeal of the priesthood and the co-operation of the laymen and women have enabled Bishop Mooney, Archbishop Mickey and Bishop O'Hern to build up an equipment of churches, of schools, of hospitals, of homes for the aged, of charitable societies, that has meant much for the church and her work. The same zeal and co-operation shall be yours in the years the Lord shall give you to labor in this diocese.
