The quarterly meeting of the Central New York Chapter of Knights of Columbus was held at Geneva, on Sunday, October 22nd.

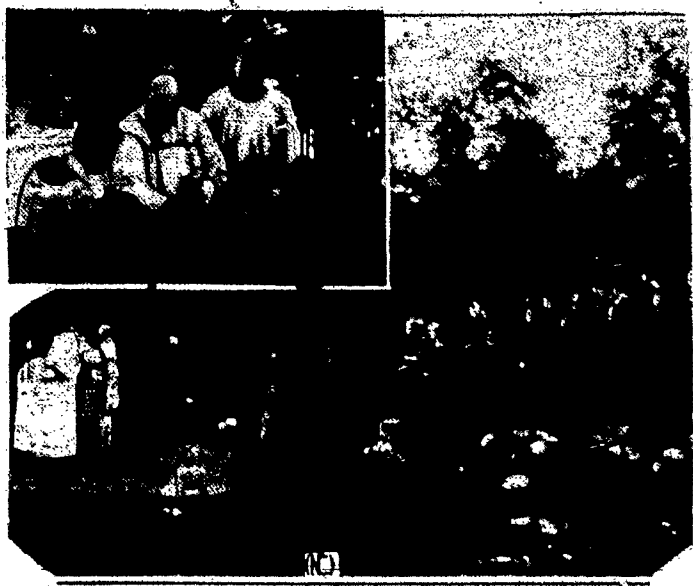
Episcopal Rector Lauds Rene Menard's Work With Indians
