Mother Mary Columba, sister of the late "Tim" Healy, first Governor-General of the Irish Free State, has died in Rome.

She was one of the counselors of the Mother General of the Dominican Congregation of St. Catherine, of South Africa. Mother Mary Columba was well known throughout South Africa, where she helped to found many convents.

On the eve of her hundredth birthday anniversary, Mrs. Turner of London walked unaided up a flight of 16 stone steps to chapel to return thanks for her long life.

Her pastor, the Rev. Austin Oates, visited her on birthday. The old woman is an inmate of the poorhouse at Kensington. She has been there 40 years.

Caushnawaga Indian reservation on the south shore of the Lawrence River, across from Lachine, lost one of its oldest and most devout Catholic residents and a colorful figure, when Mrs. Theresa Green, 95, died.
