DIOCESAN COUNCIL RECOMMENDS MOTION PICTURES NOW SHOWING

The Rochester Diocesan Council has taken a stand in the past against objectionable films and shows and indecent advertising. This has been done by resolutions passed, and protests made by both individuals and groups to managers and to producers. An opportunity now presents itself to help the cause of better films in a constructive way. The Cradle Song, which has been shown at the Century Theatre during the past week, and Little Women, now at the RKO Palace, are admirable films, and such that we feel we can recommend them to our Catholic people.

The Regent Theatre is now showing Father Bernard Hubbard's amazing experiences in Alaska, under the title Aniakchak, the Alaskan volcano. The films made by Father Hubbard during his adventures have been assembled into a vivid picture Father Hubbard visited Aniakchak by plane, flew around inside the crater for fifty minutes and finally landed on a small lake. No plane has ever been known to land inside an active volcano before.

Every inch of the way required Father Hubbard's attention and he filmed it all, returning with thousands of feet of film from this little known Alaskan territory where fire and ice are literally neighbors.

One of the objections we have made during our campaign for better films was that the box-office receipts from some of the "undesirable" pictures were so great while the better films have had to be withdrawn for lack of patronage. By the support of good films we can hope to attain the improvement of motion pictures as a form of recreation and entertainment.
