(Continued from Page 1) phrase "social justice" as something deliberately sought in the recovery legislation has an almost revolutionary significance.

If preceding administrative thought of shaping legislation so as to bring about social justice they never avowed it publicly. They seemed to have assumed, as did the eighteenth century liberals, that social justice would be automatically attained through the unrestrained operation of economic forces.

Trade Associations... "The most important economic elements of the new revolution are the trade associations set up in the various industries and the codes of fair practice which have been adopted by and for them.
