

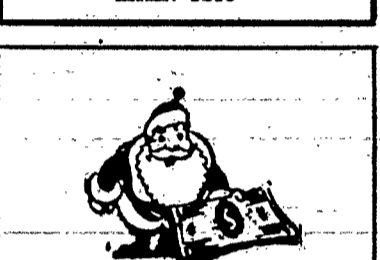

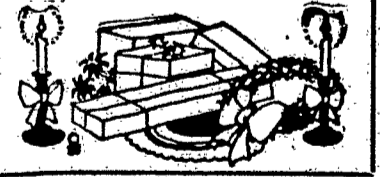

NEWSWRITING VALUE EMPHASIZED BY EDITOR BEFORE MERCY HIGH CLASS

"There is no more stern taskmaster than news writing, yet none offers more rich rewards," said Harold W. Sanford, managing editor of the "Democrat and Chronicle," in a lecture on "Woman's Place in Journalism" to the students of Journalism and one of the English IV classes of Our Lady of Mercy High School on December 7.

In addressing the students one of the first things the editor emphasized was that although few women set on a newspaper staff, their experience in studying news-writing is very valuable. According to Sanford, the four fundamentals necessary for news reporting are: "Health, education, a nose for news and an indomitable urge to be a newspaper reporter. Of these, education and an urge to learn come first. A college education is almost essential."

He also said that there were opportunities for women of proper education and talent to be successful in the field of journalism especially on the society, fashion, school and food pages as well as in feature writing. Continuing, he stated, "These opportunities are limited but those who succeed are educated and have persistence and energy. I see no reason why women should not eventually take their place side by side with men in the world of business."
