SAINT'S FAVORITE FEAST

Christmas was a favorite feast with St. Francis of Assisi, and he wished to persuade the Emperor to make a special law that men should then provide well for the birds and the beasts, as well as for the poor, so that all might have occasion to rejoice in the Lord.

The beautiful and celebrated Christmas hymn "Holy Night, Silent Night" was written on Christmas Eve, 1818, and was sung that same night in St. Nicholas' church, Oberndorf, Austria. The pastor of the church, the Rev. Josef Mohr, wrote the words, while his friend Franz Xavier Gruber, the church organist, set them to music.
