The Vatican Library has recently been enriched by a precious collection of the manuscripts and documents which refer to the famous historian, Baron Ludwig Pastor, and to his monumental work, "The History of the Popes," which covers the period from the end of the Middle Ages to the end of the eighteenth century.

Popa Plus XI replied with affectionate words, expressing all his gratitude at a gift so splendid in itself, the value of which was increased by the sacrifice the donors had made in depriving themselves of such a precious treasure.

Sister Mary Aloysia (Kierner) Ph.D., head of the English Department of Notre Dame College, Cleveland, conducted by the Sisters of Notre Dame, is the author of a new biography of Cardinal Newman, which has just been published by the Collegiate Press Corporation, Boston.

The book, entitled "John Henry Newman, the Romantic, the Friend, the Leader," has a foreword by Gilbert K. Chesterton, an introduction by the Rev. John Cavanaugh, C. S. C., president emeritus of Notre Dame University, and an appreciation of Cardinal Newman and the Sister's book by the Most Rev. Joseph Schrembs, Bishop of Cleveland.

Blanche Countess of Rosslyn, of London, who has just died at the age of 94, leaves more than 70 descendants. She was buried at Rosslyn, Scotland, and is the first Catholic to be buried there at the ancestral Rosslyn home since the Reformation.

The late Countess, it is said to have been one of the great figures of Victorian society and one of the last links with that famous social epoch; she was received into the Church in 1905 by the Rev. Bernard Vaughan, S. J.
