Against Intolerance

Indianapolis—"The Blue Shirts of Loyalty," a proposed national organization to wipe out racial prejudices and anti-American intolerances, have been chartered here by George Michael, probate commissioner of Gary; Dr. Max Herschler and Attorney Richard Kaplan, both of Gary. The first membership was offered to President Roosevelt, the second to Raymond Moley and the third to Gov. Paul V. McNutt. The founders say they will fight intolerance with every legal weapon until everyone may worship freely in his own way and brother love reigns supreme.

Two New Canada Dioceses

Ottawa—(NCWC)—Canada is to have two new dioceses, Saskatchewan and St. Jean (St. John) Quebec, according to word received from the Vatican. The Most Rev. Gerard Murray, Bishop of Saskatoon, becomes the first Bishop of Saskatchewan. The Bishop of St. Jean has not been named.

To Revise Longitudes

Shanghai—(NCWC)—The Jesuit Observatory at Ki-Ka-Wel, here, will be one of the three bases collaborating in the revision of the globe's longitudes, the other two being the observatories of Algiers and San Diego. The Ki-Ka-Wel Observatory is directed by Father Lejay, S. J., who supervises the work of the four Jesuit observatories in and about Shanghai.
