In the name of the Rochester Parish Sodality Union and as a representative of the National Advisory Board Sodality of Our Lady, Miss Anne V. Brennan has dispatched two letters to Washington protesting against the passage of the proposed Birth Control Bill scheduled for hearing this week.

As representative of the Rochester Parish Sodality Union representing over ten thousand Catholic women I hereby register official protest against Birth Control Bill H. R. 5978 scheduled January sixteenth stop we object to this bill in its entirety as thoroughly vicious, unethical, unconstitutional, un-American piece of legislation.

We beg you as our representative in Washington to enter our protest to the Judiciary Committee before Tuesday, January 16, and to fight the passage of this bill.
