 Program In Schools**

Special Health Education program approved by the Rev. John M. Duffy, Superintendent of Catholic Schools, is being carried on in the parochial schools of the City and County by the Tuberculosis and Health Association according to an announcement made today by Joseph P. Muesweeney, Chairman of the Rochester Committee.

The program, which is in charge of William Palmateer, Field Worker, included the distribution of approved educational material and the showing of educational pictures on the subjects of tuberculosis prevention, foot and body posture, and care of the teeth. A special feature of the program has to do with daily health habits, cleanliness and good food habits.

Requests for motion picture showings are being filled in the order received. Schools in which showings have already been given include: St. Andrew's, St. Joseph's, St. Mary's, St. Theresa's and St. John's.

Nurses of the Health Bureau are cooperating in the presentation of the program. Keen interest in the program and a warm response has been indicated.

**The Resurrection of Youth? Even  
 your daily papers tell you of this.**

One of the crucial points in the Concordat between Germany and the Vatican, is the very question of the freedom of the Catholic Youth Movement. And peace only came to Italy when Mussolini agreed to give the necessary freedom to Italian Catholic Youth to foster actively their organizations. Only yesterday we read that some Mexican Catholic boys were imprisoned because they boldly protested atheistic and pagan sexual instruction in the schools. Each country has its own special form of organization; but whatever form that takes, it is of Catholic Youth, and Catholic in no uncertain terms. How many know that in Europe many Catholic boys and girls save their money all year in order to retire to a monastery and make a spiritual retreat?

England is especially devoted to Catholic Scouting. And note that adjective "Catholic." France and Italy also have a great many Catholic Troops. The Holy Father during the present Jubilee Year spoke these words to 10,000 Catholic Scouts who had gathered in Rome to do him homage: "In noble, earnest, virginal hope of your religion and your Church, as of your family and country." The International Bureau of Boy Scouts reported in 1932 that there were 455,000 Catholic Scouts in the world. At the present there must be at least 500,000.

A meeting was held last week of Catholic Scouts from all parts of the Rochester Diocese. They came from as far away as Elmira, Hornell and Auburn. All were enthusiastic and pledged themselves to further Catholic Scouting. And as all are workers, we can expect things to happen in the near future.
