The Rochester Diocesan Committee is composed of representatives from the various Boy Scout Councils within the Diocese including the Rochester Council, Red Jacket Council, Finger Lakes Council, Auburn Council, Iliaca Council, Elmira Council, and the Steuben Area Council.

The St. Bonaventure Glee Club consists of 30 members, trained by Father Claude Kean, O.F.M., a graduate of the Cincinnati Conservatory of Music, and Director of the Department of Music at St. Bonaventure.

The Nazareth College Glee Club will join the St. Bonaventure Club for several numbers, and also will present separate numbers. Music for the concert, will be furnished by the Royal Collegians, the campus band of St. Bonaventure.

Proceeds for the affair are to go to the Nazareth College Building Fund, which was begun last November with the benefit Thanksgiving Day Football game and Victory dance which netted the college fund \$4,000.
