The following telegram has been received from Senator Robert F. Wagner, in reply to a letter sent to the name of the 20,000 members of the Rochester Diocesan Council of the N. C. C. W.

"Thanks for petition. Please advise others interested that I favor amendment Section 301 Communications Bill and am doing everything I can to secure its adoption."

Amendment to Section 301 of Senate Bill 2910 provides for the insurance of equity of opportunity for Educational, Religious, Agricultural, Labor, Co-operative and similar non-profit making associations seeking licenses for radio broadcasting by incorporating into the Statute a provision for the allotment to said non-profit making associations of at least 25 per cent of all radio facilities not employed in public use.
