CRUSADE FOR BETTER FILMS WIDESPREAD

The Most Rev. Joseph H. Schlarman, Bishop of Peoria, issued a pastoral letter calling for full participation in the crusade. "A shocking menace threatens the morals of our people," the Bishop said. "Christian traditions and standards seem to have snapped. Many of our own people have lost all sense of propriety. Lascivious sex films, the heroes and heroines, disseminating a pagan philosophy of life and ridiculing Christian standards; indecent entertainments; stag parties that are rank obscenity; smutty books and magazines, and so forth, that are unequivocally immoral, are considered only a bit frivolous by many of our own people. The moral turpitude of it all strikes decent people as something appalling."

A letter explaining the purposes of the "Legion of Decency" crusade has been sent by the Central Committee of the Diocese of Albany to owners of theaters. The movement, they were informed, is to impress upon producers of films that the Catholic people demand a higher moral tone in pictures. The letter also warns that there will be no let-up in the campaign until permanent improvement is noted.

Women's Council Active
In the Diocese of Rochester, sessions of the Council of Catholic Women and of the Diocesan High School Sodality Union heard speakers appeal for participation in the crusade. "The Menace of the Movies" was the subject of an address delivered by the Rt. Rev. Magr. Thomas F. McNally, rector of the Church of the Immaculate Conception, Philadelphia, from radio station WCAU. The entire Methodist Episcopal Church of the San Francisco area, consisting of 742 congregations in California, Arizona, Nevada and Hawaii, has taken action to support Catholic organizations engaged in the crusade to insure the production of clean movies. The action followed decision of 70 Methodist congregations of the Fresno-Glendale district to take part in the campaign.

Archbishop Mooney told the graduates that professional skill and human interest are not of themselves sufficient for the complete accomplishment of the end and aim of nursing the sick and infirm. Stating that to find the way to human souls is a unique, a personal task, and indicates the need for a therapeutic agency of the greatest value, Archbishop Mooney concluded his remarks by saying that as long as they were engaged in the profession of nursing there should be something of consecration in their work and service.
