**Mother's Day In Auburn Marked by Holy Name Groups**

Auburn—Holy Name Societies of Auburn received Holy Communion Sunday morning in observance of Holy Name Sunday and Mother's Day. Services were largely attended at St. Mary's, St. Alphonsus, St. Aloysius, St. Hyacinth's, St. Francis d'Assisi, Holy Family and SS. Peter and Paul Churches.

More than 400 members of the Holy Name Society of St. Alphonsus Church and their friends enjoyed a Communion breakfast in the Pompeian Room of Hotel Osborne, following the 8 o'clock Mass at St. Alphonsus Church in Genesee Street. The men marched from the edifice to the hotel in a body. Officers headed the procession, followed by members of the St. Alphonsus Church Circle of Columbian Squires and Holy Name members.

The address of welcome at the breakfast was delivered by President J. Francis Poole. Attorney Harry A. Gleason was toastmaster. Addresses were given by Father Manetti and Charles A. Tucker, chancellor of the Rochester Council, Knights of Columbus, and secretary of the Rochester Diocesan Council, N. C. C. M. Mr. Tucker's talk was on "The Catholic Church and American Ideals."

Remarks were also made by Rev. William F. Bergan, Catholic chaplain at Auburn State Prison, and Rev. Frederick G. Straub, pastor of St. Alphonsus Church.

The Holy Name Society of St. Alphonsus Church was formed in 1922 and has grown to a membership of 600. The members take an active interest in Boy Scout work, the Columbian Squires and other parish projects.

Others at the speakers' tables were William J. McLane, president of the Auburn diocese, Rochester diocesan Holy Name Union; Raymond W. Crispy of Rochester, secretary of the Rochester Diocesan Holy Name Union; and Frank J. Lesch, president of the Auburn Diocese, National Council of Catholic Men.
