Little frocks requiring only three-quarters of a yard of percale to be sent to the children of the leper colony in Uganda, British Africa, are among the garments made by the Mission Group of the Catholic Women's Club, which is giving a benefit card party at the Club House next Monday evening, May 28, to assist in carrying on its work. To be sent to the Franciscan Convent at Richmond, Va., they will be taken to Africa next month by Sister Martina who has volunteered for the leper settlement. The frocks are on exhibit at the Club House. The Group is composed mostly of women in business who meet weekly at the Club House to sew, and during the past season many warm garments have been made or remodeled and dispensed, layettes were made for the Red Cross and First Communion dresses and slips made for Rochester children.

To bridge the gap between the close of school in June and the opening in September, thereby preserving the physical and mental benefits that have been derived by each individual during the school year; 4. To keep the children safe, by providing wholesome and interesting activities in safe places and under supervision; 5. To encourage families in planning co-operative activities and recreation. What Need Is There For Volunteer Workers In This Council? During the summer there will be a rapid expansion in the recreational program of Rochester. Thirty elementary school playgrounds will be operating daily and in order to insure adequate supervision for the children on these playgrounds, it is important that we have a large number of volunteers prepared to work under the supervision of trained playground directors. The success, and very often the project itself, is solely dependent for its existence upon the volunteer. For This Leadership Training? A Recreational Institute for Volunteers will be given from June 18 to 23, as follows: (a) Lectures. (b) Demonstrations. 1. Community Recreation. 2. Athletic Contests; Group Games; Tournaments. 3. First-Aid; Swimming; Life Saving; Aquatics. 4. Tap Dancing; Social Dancing; Folk Dancing. 5. Constructive Play-Sewing.
